year old Filly to be delivered with their Inwards unto him when he shall be of the

an one Cowe & one Calf one two & one Lamb and one Black Horse now three year
old to be delivered him by my Country when he shall be of the Age of twenty one years
Item I give & bequeath to my third son William Pitm John Pitman one Cowe and one
Calf one two & one Lamb: one Bright Bay Filly one year old to be delivered by my Coun
try unto him also when he shall come to or be of the Age of twenty one years
Item I give & bequeath to my only Daughter Anne Pitman Two Cows and two Calfs one
two & one Lamb and also the first shoe or mare Calf that my Black mare with a
white Star in the forehead shall Breed with her Inwards together to be delivered by my Coun
try unto my said Daughter at or upon her day of marriage. Item I give & bequeath to my
Dear and Loving wife Elizabeth Pitman all the Residue of my good Cattle and Tracts
and do also constitute make & ordain my said wife Elizabeth Pitman full & sole Country
of this my last will & Testament utterly Reversing & disallowing of all other former wills & Testa
ments Ratifying these Confirming these & no other to be my last will & Testament In witness

 ewe & one lamb: and also the first shoe or mare Calf that my black mare with a
 white star in the forehead shall breed with for ymroofs together to be delivered by my Execu-
 tions unto my said Daughter at or upon her day of marriage. Item I give & bequeth to my
 Dear and Loving wife Elizabeth Pitman all the Residue of my good Cattle and Cattle
 and do also constitute make & ordain my said wife Elizabeth Pitman full & sole Executrix
 of this my last will & Testament utterly Revokeing & disallowing of all other former wills & testa-
 ments Ratifying this & Confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament In witness
