 I give & Bequeath to my son James Richard the Land w^{ch} I now
 live on with the appurtenances to him & his heirs forever
 I give the right of all my land above mentioned for the bringing up
 of - & raising all my children until my youngest son shall arrive
 to the age of Fifteen years & that my Negro be kept on that land
 to work thereon for that purpose until the hour of death of my last
 living child as mentioned I then give & Bequeath to my Negro
 & personal estate of what nature & value to be Equally Divided among
 my five children vizt Robert James, John Charles & David (all 3 divided
 at the hour of my death as to arriving to the age of Fifteen years
 I so nominate & appoint my friends Mr. Gentry or George Rogers
 or Mr. Magill or Mr. Morris Dale Parker & my Mother w^{ch} I choose
 to be Executors of this my last will & testament & that they have the sole management
 of my Estate & the care of bringing up my children during their minority
 & that my said children be brought up in a good education manner & to be
 learned in the best man or my Estate will afford & to acknowledge this to be
 my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal this Twentieth Day of April 1757
