This record of gift from William Campbell to  
Mina Campbell the former was acknowledged in Court  
and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1810  
Between James McMillan of the one part and William  
of the other, both of the State of Virginia and County of  
Richmond that the said James McMillan for the consideration  
of one hundred pounds current money of the said State  
to him in hand paid to the said William Campbell the sum of  
one hundred pounds current money of the said State  
confirming to the said William Campbell his heirs and assigns  
permanently a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being  
the County of Lee a portion of the land of the said

Survey being made the 25<sup>th</sup> day of October one thousand nine  
hundred and ninety eight, situate on the south side of a survey  
of lands formerly belonging to William McMillan of Washington  
County, Virginia, said former survey lying East of Millers  
Creek and on both sides of a small stream known by  
the name of grade branch, & the above mentioned two hundred  
and twenty five acres intended to be conveyed are bounded as follows to  
wit. Beginning at two white oaks corner to the above  
survey of William McMillan and with a line thereof  
S 46° W 165 poles to a black and gum N 71° poles to two white oaks  
S 40° W 165 poles to point of S. 6 East 164 to point of N 54° E 232 poles  
to point of North 70 poles to the first station. Together with all waters  
under, above, through, around and appurtenances thereto  
belonging to the said William Brance his heirs & assigns  
forever To the sole use & behoof of him the said William  
Brance his heirs and assigns.

Survey of William McMillan and with a line thereof  
S 46 W 164 poles to a black and gum N 71 poles to two white oaks  
S 40 W 165 poles to pointings S 6 East 144 to pointings N 57 E 232 poles  
to pointings North 170 poles to the first station. Together with all woods  
timber, stones, minerals, Hereditaments and appurtenances thereto  
belonging to the said William Briance his heirs & assigns  
forever To the sole use & behoof of him the said William  
Briance his heirs and assigns forever and the said James  
McMillan for himself and his heirs with covenant and agree  
with the said William Briance his heirs and assigns that  
he the said James McMillan and his heirs the said lands  
with all its appurtenances unto the said William Briance  
his heirs and assigns for ever against all persons for ever  
will warrant and defend in testimony whereof the said  
James McMillan hath hereunto subscribed his name the day  
and year first above written.
