all and singular the privileges & appurtenances therunto belong or in anywise
appertaining to the said David Nor and his heirs to the sole use and behoof
of the said David Nor and his heirs and assigns forever, and the said
William Byrd for himself and his heirs and assigns forever unto the said David
Nor and his heirs to have and to enjoy forever defend the said 200 acres of land
against all person & persons & things whatsoever In witness whereof the said
