

This Indenture made the tenth day of April in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and twenty six Between William Oly of the  
County of Maryland and State of Maryland of the one part and John Clegg  
of the County of Lee and State of Virginia of the other part witnesseth that  
the said William Oly for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand  
dollars to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof he has acknowledged,  
hereby doth give and convey to the said John Clegg his heirs and assigns  
one certain tract of land of his own and being in the County of  
Lee and State of Virginia, containing one hundred acres be the same  
more or less, which land lies on the north side of Bull Run and was  
granted to William Sloane by patent from the Commonwealth of Virginia  
bearing date the eighth day of February 18<sup>th</sup> 1714 and bounded on the south  
of land lies joining Sists of Parkinson Rutherford and formerly  
draw Baker but now held by William Oly and is bounded as follow  
etc tenit Beginning at a white Oak, corner to said Baker's land and  
among N & S 15° E 16 poles to a black Oak and so to a white Oak  
and so to a pine tree of which there is a mark  
S 80° W 115° E 16 poles to a white Oak

Know all men by these presents that I William Edgley of  
Wadebridge in the County of Cornwall have made and do make this 27th day of  
February 1696/7 before me John Sturton Esq; a Notary Publick in and for the said County of  
Cornwall & before the presence of the said Philip Daniel his  
Chapman and Servant and have sealed the same with my Seal  
and delivered the same to the said Philip Daniel at his house in  
Cromwell Street in the said Town of Wadebridge in the said County of Cornwall  
and doth further seal the same with my Seal by the said Philip Daniel his  
Chapman and Servant and doth deliver the same to the said Philip Daniel his  
Chapman before me, all the intent whereof to be that I doth part of land  
with all and singular, its appertinences unto the said Philip Daniel his  
heirs and assigns to the sole use and behoif of him the said Philip Daniel  
his Chapman forever and to make William Edgley his said  
Attest a copy of this instrument to be given and agreed to and with  
the said Philip Daniel his heirs and assigns against the right, title,  
claim or demand of him and his heirs will forever defend. In witness  
whereof the said William Edgley his said Chapman have hereunto their  
names and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.

29th February 1758. I William Ely of Boston in the County of Suffolk  
of Leonard Street of Boston in the said County do hereby and for my  
successors and assigns forever give and grant to the said Philip Daniel  
and his heirs and assigns forever all my right title and interest  
in consideration of the sum of one thousand pounds of Boston  
and other bargains, pett and conveyances made by me in this sum  
paid before all the interest due to the said Philip Daniel and his  
widow and his heirs, it is agreed between the said Philip Daniel his  
heirs and assigns to the sole use and behoof of him to said Philip Dani-  
el his heirs and assigns forever and to said William Ely by his said  
attorneys for him self his heirs and assigns of the agreement and covenants and with  
the said Philip Daniel his heirs and assigns against the right title  
claim or demand of him and his heirs all forever to stand. In witness  
whereof the said William Ely by his said attorneys has hereunto set his  
name and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.
