Imprimis it is my will and I do order that in the first place all my just debts and funeral charges be paid. Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth one third of both real and personal Estates and free possession of all and singular, she is to keep my Children and bring them up in a good and Christian manner and Religion as a mother of Children ought to do, but she is to keep all and singular alwaies in good and sufficient repaire until the chifftal of the Childrens Age then to deliver the same as she receives it if any thing not delivered in the same order she is to make it good according to the praiement and valuation thereof. Item I give and bequeath to my son Jacob and to my daughter Charlotter, and the third Child which is to come all and singular of the two thirds into Equall parts or portions, Except the Child to come and not yet boyn I give and bequeath to him over and above his portion the sum of Twenty five pounds Current money, And I hereby make and Ordaine Nicholas ott and Adam Shover to my Exeutors of this my last will and Testament whom I impower to perform and fullfill and see it to be performed and fullfilled that my Children will be well taken Care of, and if one of the said Exeutors should die the same which shall remain in life to have power and libertie to choose an other in the rooms. And I do hereby attorney Disallow, revoke and disannull all and Every other former Testaments Wills & Legatis and Exeutors by me in any way before this time named willd and bequethed — Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above Written.

 Uncertainty of Human Life do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament
 Viz. I give & Bequeath to my Loving Wife Dodhunter the Choice of two
 of my Dowers and two Cores. & I appoint my Wife & my son John Dodhunter my
 Executors & my Will is that they shall Jointly enjoy & possess the plantation I
 now live on & a small tract of Land on the Road side Joining Dohaven During her
 Widowed & that they shall have the Care & Guardianship of my small Children & my
 Will is that all my sons be bound out to service when they arrive at the age of sixteen
 years. My Will is in case my Wife Marry again that she may then possess only one
 third part of the two tracts of Land above Mentioned & that the guardianship of my
 Children be removed from her solely to my son John. my Will is that my son John
 at the death of my Wife have these two tracts of Land to him and his heirs for ever, the
 paying sixty pounds Current money to be equally divided among all my other
 Children that shall be then living or their representatives. My Will is that all the
 remainder of my personal Estate be sold to the best advantage by my Executors &
 also a tract of Land Joining to a Meadow Containing upwards of four hundred
 acres My Will is that my Executors sell that tract of Land if the same at private sale
 Within twelve Months after my decease provided they can get four hundred pounds
 Current money for it to be paid within eighteen Months of the Day of sale & if not my
 will is that twelve Months after my decease they advertise that tract of Land for sale -
 & sell it to the highest bidder at eighteen Months Credit the money arising by the sale
 of my Goods & Chattels as aforesaid & by the sale of the above tract of Land after the payment
 of my just debts, I leave to be divided among all my Children as follows my son Isaac
 Dodhunter to have a double share & all the rest John Dodhunter to share equally allowing
 what some of them have paid of me & I have charged them with no part of their shares my
 will is that my young Children receive Interest for their shares after they come to

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Martial of the County of Loudoun being sick and weak but of perfect sense and memory calling to mind that it is appointed to all men once to die do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, and as to what worldly Goods it has pleased Almighty God of his great mercy to endue me with I give and bequeath in the following manner Viz. I give to my son James Martial and damned Martial the whole of my Lands in Loudoun County. Being the plantation I now live on and which I purchased of John Carlyle Gent of Fairfax Co^b to them jointly and their heirs for ever. Together with all other my personal Estates upon the following Conditions and restrictions Viz. First of all during the widowhood of my loving Wife Marshal Martial they are to let her live in the small room of my Dwelling house and known by the name of her room. They are also to keep her up two Milch Cows, and to pay her yearly three pounds Virginia Currant, fifteen bushels wheat and five bushels of Rye or Indian Corn, she is also to keep her Bed and furniture, and her large Chest likewise to reserve a yearly fifty pounds of Pork and fifty pounds of Beef. But in Case she should Marry after my Death she is not intitled thereto any of the above mentioned Articles, unless it be her Bed and furniture which she to take in full for all and every other matter or thing before mentioned. They are also to take care of and properly support and school their two young Brothers Joseph Martial and Robert Martial until they shall arrive to the age of sixteen, when, my desire is that they may be bound to trades at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and when they arrive at the age of twenty one years to be paid thirtysix pounds each as their full proportion of my Estates. They are to take care of Cloath raias and school their three young Sisters, Viz Mary

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Joseph Martial's Will. *Martial, Margaret Martial and Nathaniel Martial until they shall*
arrive to the age of eighteen years, when they are to be paid twenty pounds
each as their full proportion of my Estates. They are also five years after my
Deaths to pay their Sister Martha &annah ten pounds as her full part of my
Estate. And whereas I am indebted to sundry people. My Sons James
Martial and Samuel Martial are also to pay those Debts. If by their Industry
together with the products of my Crops now in the yard and growing they possibly

 be kept equipped with the hands thereon, until the white servants theron be free & what
 profit arises from the said plantation to be Equally divided between my Son & Daughter,
 Thomas John Chilton & Mary Chilton, & then the goods of the said plantation to be
 sold, & my Daughter Mary Chilton to receive the purchase money, Item, I desire all
 the rest of my Estate be Equally Divided between, My son & Daughter, Tho: John
 Chilton & Mary Chilton, Item, my Desire is that my loving wife Ann Chilton
 Tho: Gresham, Anthony Rizzell, & Tho: Lewis, be my whole & sole Executors of this
 my Last will and Testament, Witness my hand & seal this second Day of —

son James becomes possessor of the Plantation & Goods left my Wife for a term —

pounds each curr^t. money. I give and bequeath a piece of land Contain^{J 1/2} acres
whereon the Baptist Meeting House is built. Joining this Plantation to Joseph
Thomas Minister & William Lewis & Thomas George Eldore of S. Meeting to them
& their Successors no Ministers & Eldore of S. Congregation for ever. I appoint my
son James my sole Executor. I Will that my Executor make Deeds of Conveyance of
