And whereas my Father did by his last Will & Testament give to my two ~~eldest~~ children ~~Agg~~ (Lydia and Nicholas) a certain negro woman called Agg with her children and it is my will and desire that my other Children should have an equivalent therof It is my will that the sum of Fifty pounds be paid by James Weston his Heirs Executors or Administrators to my son Abner Osborne when he arrives at the age of twenty one years and the like sum of fifty pounds be paid by my son Nicholas to my Daughter Mary when she arrives at the age of eighteen years

2nd I give my wife Patience Osborne all my land on the North side of Kettleton Creek where I now live during her natural life at her decease to go to the Child she is now Pregnant with should it survive her if it should not survive her then to her her heirs and Assigns forever

I also give to my said wife all my personal Estate to dispose of as she may think proper (except two Slaves hereafter mentioned) and

all the rents issues and profits of my other Lands until the division happens
for mentioned takes place and may two eldest children receive their

shares then the other half until my son Abner receives his shares

14th It is my Will and desire that my negro man called Phil. be
emanicipated within fifteen years from this date and my negro
woman called Judy within ten years from this date

And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Patience
Osborne and my son in Law James Heaton and my Friends
William Osborne and Lucy Taylor to execute this my last
