Lee Geo.<sup>d</sup> Will I George Lee of Farmwell, Loudoun County and State of Virginia do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, signed with my Name and sealed & dated this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1802.

1<sup>st</sup> It is my desire that all my just debts shall be paid for which purpose I leave all the property that may come to me from the Estate of my brother Wm A. Lee decd. should that property together with the Rents and Crops of my own Estate not be sufficient to pay my debts, I empower my Executor & Executrix herein after mentioned to dispose of such my property as they may think proper for that purpose —

2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my wife Evelyn Byrd Lee all my Estate both real & personal (after my just debts are paid) during her widowhood for the support of herself & my children, and during her life following Negroes Frank, Caroline, Peter, Sam, Tall, & Ned this last bequest is made in view of Negroes I sold, that were settled on her and as I suppose there is a difference in the nature of the Negroes against her, it is my desire and I hereby empower my

Executor (herein after mentioned) to pay my wife should she marry again five hundred dollars of the first money collected from the Estate left my Son George Lee. —

3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my Daughter Maria Carter Lee at the Marriage of her Mother or when she arrives at the age of sixteen, one thousand Acres of Land in the County of Loudoun to be laid off on the west side of the ~~old~~ Road and adjoining the Land of Mr. Samuel Lee, my brother Thomas L. Lee, to be bounded by the present ~~old~~ Road as far as it is necessary to give the quantity of one thousand Acres I request my Executor to have the above Land laid off as soon as possible which survey must be binding on my Heirs I also leave her at the death of her Mother my two Negroes Patrick & Nelly. —

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my Son George Lee at the Marriage or death his Mother all my Lands in the County of Loudoun, not settled on her, or given to his Sister; and at his Mother's death, I give and bequeath to my Son George Lee the whole of the property settled on his Mother both real & personal, except the Negroes I sold; and the Household & Kitchen Furniture which I leave to his Mother, I also leave my Son George Lee the six Negroes left to his Mother during her life after her death. I leave my son George residuary Legatee this my last Will & Testament. I leave my brother — Thomas L. Lee of Coton as Executor and my Wife Evelyn Lee as Executrix to this Will and leave the two above named persons guardians to my Children until my Son George Lee arrives at the age of seven Years then it is my Will & desire that my Brother Thos L. Lee should have the inter direction of him signed, sealed & dated to the day & year above mentioned.

 Jupiter for the term of seven Years, Dick, Will  
 and Ned for the term of twenty Years, and so for  
 the term of thirty Years, and after the expira-  
 tion of the Natural Life of my s<sup>d</sup> Wife my slaves

that I am to be a free Woman, and the other  
 Negroes at the expiration of the above men-  
 tioned Terms - And I likewise give unto my  
 Wife all my Cattle, and Horses, Books, Im-  
 plements of Husbandry and Household furniture.  
 Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved  
 Wife Jane her Heirs and Assigns forever one  
 half of All my Lands in Loudoun County in  
 Virginia and the other half of ~~of~~ Lands in Lou-  
 doun County. I order my Executors hereafter nam-  
 ed to sell and pay my just debts and the over-  
 plus that shall remain after my debts are paid  
 I give and bequeath unto my Nephew and  
 Nieces Children of my Brother Asa Thompson  
 deceased that is to say to John, Mary, Eunice,  
 Sarah, Rebecca, and Phoebe to be equally divi-  
 ded among them, upon Condition the above ~~of~~


