of death and the uncertainty of the time I do make and ordain the following will and  
testament in manner and form following first commanding my soul into the hands  
of Almighty god that gave it hoping to be saved by the grace and death and passion of my

Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ and my body I command to the ground and as touching  
such worldly estate where with of death released god to bless me with grace and the  
peace of his salvation and from following Jesus to my son Peter part of my Land com-  
ing to his said beginning at a red Oak by the river number Three 1760 Dape said 21  
July 1760 a red Oak by the road stand a long thorned North 282 degrees West 56  
Poles South 15 degrees east 18 N 20 degrees West 9 1/2 poles North 9 1/2 West 16 poles to a  
pine tree said North 1 degree west 110 poles to a holly on Daples said stand on  
his line North 19 1/2 degrees west 97 poles to red Oak corner there stands 11 degrees  
East 244 poles to the beginning containing 11 acres more or less found to my Sister  
Mary Anne Mulling Ague to my son Charles and Mulling Ague being on 1000 acres  
I give my wife Elizabeth and Mulling Ague to my Daft Anne and Mulling Ague to my  
son George the bed and bedding belonging thereto had his mother deceased and all the  
belongings of any goods partly leaving wife the Land and Plantation to goe my  
younger son left to distrest his mother I have my wife and any son George fully discharged  
she and may my self without qualment as witness my hand and seal this 26th  
day of Oct 1760

The Last will and Testamant of Indra Hunter Esq. was proved in Court by  
Jane Hunter and George Hunter Executrix and also therein named witnesses  
John Thendo according to Law and was further proved by the oaths of Wm Johnson  
and Samuel D. Powell the wife of John Thendo who also made Oath that they see  
Nicholas Johnson Esq. Subske her self a witness thereto in the presence and  
the regard of the testator which is ordered to be recorded and on the motion of  
the Procuror and Law and they performing what is usual in such cause  
Committed to record there for thenceforth to be called Record Law which will  
Stephen Hunter and William the executors Testate

1700<sup>th</sup> day of January by their Friends, that we Jane Hunter, George Hunter, William Hunter, William Hunter, and wife and family bound to the Justices, Mr. Anderson,  
Arch<sup>d</sup> Anderson, Mr. Anderson, Esq<sup>r</sup>, Just<sup>r</sup> Justice of the Peace of Linlithgowshire, and  
Galloway, in the sum of One Hundred Pounds to the payment whereof (well and)  
Fully to be made to the said Justices and their successors, two hundred pounds  
and each of us, our, and each of our Heirs Executors, and Administrators, jointly  
and severally, jointly by these presents sealed with our seals, this thirtieth day  
of July in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Five;  
(And the Seventy fifth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord & George the Third)

The condition of the above Oath is such, that if the above bound  
Jane Hunter and George Hunter Executors of the said Will and the executors  
of Andrew Hunter Deceased do make or cause to be made, a true and true  
seal Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of the said  
Deceased, which now, or shall come to his hands, profession of acknowledge  
of the said Jane and George or into the hands and possession of any other person  
or persons for whom they may be made, do conflict with the Inventory (copy)  
of Louis at such time as they shall be thereunto required by the said George  
and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other goods, chattels, and cre-  
dits of the said Deceased which at any time after shall come to his hands  
Profession or Knowledge, of the said Jane and George or into the hands and  
possession of any other person or persons for them to well and truly deliver up,

acts of the said Decedent which along time after shall come to the knowledge  
of his heirs or Friends, of the said late and George or into his hands and  
by command of any other person or persons for him to well and truly administer  
according to law, and further do make a just and true account of the  
actions and doings therein when required by the said Court; and  
also shall well and truly pay and Deliver all the Legacies contained and  
specified in the said Last Will and Testament as for the said goods Chattels and  
duties, will thereunto entituled, and shall have and enjoy the same  
to be paid and of money effect on the day and in full sum and  
value.
