Testament in manner and form following First I recommend my Soul into the hands
of Almighty god that gave it hoping to be saved by the precious death and passion of my
Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ and my Body I commit to the ground and as touching
such worldly Estate where with I hath pleased god to bless me with I give and be-
queath thereof in manner and form following I give to my son Peter part of my Land com-
ing to his Line beginning at a red Oak by the river running thence N^o 60 Yards East 2 1/2
Poles to a red Oak sapling by the road thence a long the road North 2 1/2 degrees West 3 1/2
Poles North 13 degrees East 18 N^o 20 degrees West 3 2 Poles North 38 1/2 West 16 Poles to a
pine thence North 1 degrees West 1 1/2 Poles to a richory in Dabneys Lane thence on
his Line North 19 1/2 degrees West 2 1/2 Poles to a red Oak Corner thence South 14 degrees
East 2 1/2 Poles to the beginning containing 12 aches more of Land I give to my Daughter
Mary One Shilling I give to my son George One Shilling I give to my son William one
I give to my son Christopher one Shilling I give to my Daughter Jane one Shilling I give to my
son George the bed and clothing belong thereto at his mothers death and all the
Remainder of my goods to my Loving wife the Land and Plantations to George and
Younger son his to inherit the another I leave my life and any son George I only desire
that he pay my debt without payment as witness my hand and Seal this 26th
Day of Oct^r 1764

At a Court held for Laurens County the 26th Day of Oct. 1764
The Last will and Testament of Andrew Hunter Dec. was proved in Court by
Jane Hunter and George Hunter Executors and two thereon named who made
Oath thereto according to Law and was further proved by the Oath of Wm. Johnson
and Samuel Powell two of the witnesses thereto who also made Oath that they saw
Nicholas Johnson Dec. subscribe the Will as a witness thereto in the presence and
the request of the Testator which is ordered to be recorded and on the motion of
the Executors and two and they performing what is usual in such Cases
Certificate is granted them for obtaining a full and lawful Grant of the same and for the

Know all men by these presents, that we Jane Hunter, George Hunter, Andrew Hunter, William Pelly and helet and firmly bound to the John, Nath. Anderson, Nath. Anderson, John Crocker Gent Justices of the Court of Quarter Sessions now sitting, in the sum of Two Hundred pounds to the payment whereof, well and truly to be made to the said Justice and their successors, we bind ourselves and each of us, our, and each of our Heirs Executors, and Administrators, Jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals, this thirteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven (And the seventh Year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the third)

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that if the above bound Jane Hunter and George Hunter Executors of the Last Will and Testament of Andrew Hunter Deceased do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of the said Deceased, which now, or shall come to the hands, possession of or knowledge of the said Jane and George or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for them or the same so made, do exhibit into the County Court of Louisa at such time as they shall be thereunto required by the said Court and the same goods Chattels and credits, and all other ^{the} goods Chattels, and credits of the said Deceased, which at any time after shall come to the hands possession or knowledge, of the said Jane and George or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for them do well and truly deliver

debt of the said Decedent, which at any time after shall come to the hands
 of the said Jane and George or into the hands and
 possession of any other person or persons for them do well and truly discharge
 According to Law; and further do make a Just and true Account of their
 Actings and doings therein when shoud be required by the said Court; and
 also shall well and truly pay and Deliver all the Legacies contained and
 Specified in the said Testament as far as the said goods Chattels and Cre-
 dits, will thereunto extend, and the Law shall Charge them this Obliga-
 tion to be void and of none effect, or be so remain in full force and
 Value.
