Ordain my Sole Executors. HERE I Give and Bequeath to my
Daughter Mary Johnson one Shilling I leave the four hundred
Acres of Land lying on Sick Branch which I purchased of David
Anderson, to be sold, also if there be a Necessity for it, that forty
Acres of Land lying on the South Side of Hickory Creek it be-
ing part of the Tract on which I Dwell, and all the Rest of
my Estate after my Debts are paid I send to my Dear & Be-
loved Wife Mary Bibb in During her natural Life, then
after her Decease, I leave the Tract of Land whereon I now In-
ell to be sold and the Money to be Equally Divided with all

the Rest of My Estate, (including those which come by my
Wife's supposed. Now to be in the Hands of John Richmond) be-
tween my Children, and Lastly I appoint My son William
Bubb, my son John Bubb, and James Bubb my sole Executor
of this my last will and Testament. As Witness my hand
and Seal this 15th Day of November in the Year of our Lord
Christ one Thousand seven Hundred and Sixty Seven
under our four words, and the Quene's, & for it before Aforesaid
