testify that I do make and constitute this my last will
and testament in manner and form as followeth. I give
& bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Pickett to her & her Heirs forever
one Negro Woman named Fanny & all her increase, and all the rest
of my Estate which she has in her Possession, I give & bequeath to
my son William Glover to him and his Heirs forever, one Negro
man named Mabel, and all the rest of my Estate that he has in his
Possession, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Morris,
to her and her Heirs forever one Negro Woman named Paty & all the
Rest of my estate that she has in her Possession, I give & bequeath
to my son John Glover to him and his Heirs forever, one Negro Boy
named Henry and all the rest of my estate if he has in his Possession
I give & bequeath to my son William Glover to him and his Heirs
forever, one Negro Boy named David and the rest of my Estate that
he has in his Possession, I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth

Dollins, and two Hens forever one Negro Woman Named Sarah
and her increase one Cow and Calf. & all the rest of my Estate that
she has in her Possession, I Give and bequeath to my Son, John
to him & his Heirs forever, one Negro Boy Named Nick also, one other Negro
Boy Named Jack, and all the rest of my Estate that he has in his Possession
also one Pair of Horse & Hobbles, I Give and bequeath to my Daughter
Susanna Glyn to her and her Heirs forever, one Negro Boy Named James
also one Negro Girl Named Kate the best feather Bed and furniture
I have, a Cow and half an Iron Pot, and Twenty shillings Cash.
I Give & bequeath to my son Henry Glyn all that Land or Ground
that I am now in Possession of, & that I have by Purchase, or otherwise
and thirty Acres, I Give, it is my will and Desire that all the rest of my
Estate, both Real & Personal that is not already Mentioned, shall be sold
and the Profit arising from such sale, to be Equally Divided amongst
the above Legates, I do constitute and appoint my son Henry Glyn
sole & sole Executor of this my last will & Testament, as witness my
Hand and the 28th Day of November Anno Domini 1776.

At a Court held for Louisa County on
Monday the 6th day of April 1775 This Will was this Day in open
Court Proved by the Oath of Thomas Jackson & ordered to be Recorded
and At a Court held for the same County on Monday the 8th
Day of May 1775 the same was further Proved by the Oath of
William Jackson and ordered to be Recorded.
