named Gals little Betsy with her Incees for ever I am I give
& bequeath to my son Philip one negro boy named Har-
to him & his heirs forever I am I Give & bequeath
to my Daughter Jane one negro Girl named Nanny to her & her
heirs forever I am I give & bequeath to my Daughter
Elizabeth one negro girl named Judy to her & her heirs
Forever I am I give to my son Aylett one negro boy
named Solomon to him & his heirs forever I am I give
all the Remains of my Estate after my Just Dells are

my loving wife Mary Gray and seven Children
viz Charles Elizabeth Mary Ann Barbara
Rachel and Thomas to be equally divided among
them she and her children and lastly I do
and appoint my loving son Charles Gray and
Martin they to be Executors of this my last Will
