the County of Louisa in the Colony of Virginia

in health and of perfect Memory thanks be given to Almighty
God for the same but calling to mind the uncertainty
this transitory life and being willing to settle my
Affairs in order to make this my last will and testament
in the manner and form following Viz I commend my
soul to God who gave it hoping through the Death and Resurrection
of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made partaker of the never
fading Joy of Immortality at the Day of Resurrection and as for
that temporal Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon
me I shall dispose of as followeth Item I give and bequeath
to my son Robert Fleming my Negroe Will and all
Gift is here and his heirs forever and Item George
Lees and Isiah and the Land he now lives upon to my son
Isiah I give and bequeath to my son William Fleming
and his heirs forever and all the rest of the Negroes to

and his heirs for ever and all the rest of the Negroes who
remain for the Use of my beloved Wife Sarah Hemm
and her little son Harry as long as either of them
lives if Harry should be the longest lived my wife
Sarah is and I order it so that my son Robert or
son William may keep him by us whether by the year
or half year or quarter or until their best advantage
the Use of all the rest of the Negroes for the maintenance
of Harry and I desire you may be careful for the souls
of your own souls I leave my two sons and my wife to
their own Factors and where my wife depts to divide
the stock equally between you and when Harry depts
to divide the Negroes in like Manner and as soon
as I am dead one of you under take to collect all my
Debts and take for your troubles present and future
pay what I owe with the rest I desire this to be done
