my Decease According to my present Desires have thought Expedient
to make my Last Will and Testament in manner following
I hereby Command my Spirit into the Hands of my
Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ, and as to my Body I have it be buried
at the Direction of my Wife and Child hereafter Mentioned
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne Garrison
Negro boy named Jack a Negro girl named Lotty a white saddle
and by name named William and a riding good Coat of Colly
and sundry furniture to her and her Heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my dear Nephew George the Land
I purchased of John Edrington from the Lower South Corner of Robert
Harris at the fork of Johnsons Creek all that is above a line
named Sue a Bed and furniture for a Cow a calf to him & his heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Higglesworth
one Negro boy named Dick, a Goat named Jesse the basin for soap
to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son
William Thomas half the Land back of the New Design fence one Negro
named Betty a Mare and Colt and Saddle that he has now in

possession, a Cow and calf and a Bed and furniture to him and his
heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Clifton Thomas
the other half of the Land back of the New Design fence to be divided between
them as they can best agree, one Negro Man named Jeffery a young boy
named two years old, my Riding Saddle, one Bed and furniture,
and a Cow and calf, to him and his heirs forever.

I give
and bequeath unto my son Geo Thomas a Part of Land
Beginning at the fork between here and John Edringtons and
running thence a straight line to where my fence line crosses the
road thence down the road to my lower corner on Joseph Thomsons

line, thence along the line to the Digger's line thence along the
line crossing the side of Digger's Mill Pond thence up the Pond
corner of the New Design fence, thence along the fence straight to the
upper line, thence to the beginning also one Negro Man named
Francis, a middling good Peast and Saddle a Bed and furniture
a middling good gun and a Cow and Calf to him and his forever
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne Pearson three hundred
Pound land, also a Negro Man named Sam, a middling good
Peast and Saddle, a middling good gun, a Bed and furniture, a Cow and
Calf and a good Saddle, I give and bequeath unto my daughter
and bequeath unto my daughter Anne Pearson one Negro boy
named Anthony, a Negro named Pegg, a middling good Peast and
Saddle, a Bed and furniture, and a Cow and Calf and half year
Schooling, to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Elizabeth Pearson one Negro boy named Dan
one Negro girl named Phillis, a middling good Peast and Side
Saddle a Bed and furniture, a Cow and Calf and half year
Schooling, to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Anne Pearson one Negro Man named John
one Negro Man named Peter, a middling good Peast and Saddle

Also a Bed and furniture, a Cow and Calf and three years schooling
 to her and her heirs forever. I Will give and bequeath unto
 my son David Thomson the sum and value of my Land, (after
 my wife Anne's decease) that he should have when she
 dies, Also a Negro boy named Isaac, a riding good Beast
 and saddle, a Bed and furniture, also a riding good Gun,
 a Cow and Calf and five years schooling to him and his
 heirs forever. I Will give and bequeath unto my Daughter
 Sarah Thomson a Negro boy named Isaac, and a Girl named
 Jane, a riding good Beast and saddle Also a Bed and
 furniture, a Cow and Calf and three years schooling to
 her and her heirs forever. And in case either of my
 children should die before they should come of age, or marry,
 then their part of my Estate I give to be equally divided
 amongst all my surviving children. I Will, after all
 my Debts are paid I give and bequeath all the Rest of
 my Estate not so bequeathed unto my dear and
 beloved Wife Anne Thomson's heirs and hers forever

I Will I nominate, constitute, and appoint

Castle Appomattox, constitute, and are joint and
several heirs Anne Thomson, son Rodas Thomson and
William Thomson, their mother Est. and Est. of their
Land Hill and Testimony, hereby Terrence all the Hill
or Hills by me hereby you and I and I desire this to be
my Land Hill and Testimony. In Witness Whereof
