who gave it, Hoping his gracious Acceptance of my
Soul thro the Merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour.

my Body I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken
 in hopes of a glorious resurrection at the last Day. As for such worldly
 goods, as God hath blessed me with after all my sinful &
 just debts are paid I Dispose of the same as follows
 I am my Will is that the Whole of my Estate of Whatsoever
 Kind may be kept together and improved to the best
 Advantage During the Minority of my youngest Son
 & that they be Maintained & well Educated such of the Goods
 of the same. When my youngest Daughter Joanna comes
 of full Age, then my Will is that my sd Estate be Equally
 Divided Among my eight Children hereafter named (viz.)
 Milly, Kitty, Hezekiah, Betty, William, Nancy, John
 Joanna, & as for my other four Children who have been
 and viz Anne, Susanna, Mary & Jane. I hereby declare

from any part of my Estate; & as for my Eldest
Child & Above Named to whom I have left my Estate
my Will is that they shall Lively & peaceably Acquiesce
in all respects to this my Will & if any of them behave
themselves Unreasonably & Disturb or look about
the Division of my Estate my Will is that, he, she or
them are hereby Declared Disinherited & their parts or shares
to be Equally Divided Among those of my Children who
behave themselves Agreeable & peaceable. Item my Desire
is that my Executors hereafter Mentioned shall move my
Family Down either to Lanover or Caroline County, Where
they may be convenient to a Standing School. Lastly I
my trusty Friend Johnson Talcom of Caroline County &
