my whole Estate real and personal but if she
marries that she may give Bond & sufficient
security for the said Estate and after her death
I leave the same to my sons John Macalester
the Plantation Surveyor & my lineal heirs the
said John Macalester & his heirs the said William Macalester

due to a broken Bone thence a long time between
Thomas and my self including fifty Acres of
Land of Thompsons. I have given to my Son Gastard
all the other part of my Land. For my wife's life
before mentioned but if he should die before he comes of
Age to my Son Alexander and all the rest of my Estate
mentioned amongst all my Children except my son. Then be
mentioned and it is my will and desire if any of my Children
should die before they come of Lawfull Age their Parts to be
divided amongst the Survivors and lastly I do constitute and
Appoint my Wife Elizabeth Hackalster my daughter
Thomas Thomas and Nathaniel Gastard to witness
my last Will and Testament in testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this twentieth day of Decr
