In the name of God, Amen, I Decharner  
Delgraffeur of Lunenburg County, being sick of body,  
but of perfect mind and memory, Thanks be to God for his  
Mercy, bating to mind the mortality of the Body, do make  
and ordain this my Last Will and Testament, Revoking  
all former Will or Wills and also all in Writings Testam-  
-entary heretofore by me made, and do declare & acknowledge  
this to be my last Will and Testament, as followeth  
to wit, Imprimis, I Give and bequeath unto my  
beloved wife Lucretia Delgraffeur Eight Negroes to wit,  
Lydda, James, Cunningham, Juda, Amber, Harry, Jimmy,  
Jerry, and Abel, One mare named Fanny, and one horse  
named Leggs, with the future increase of the said  
Slaves to her and her heirs forever, My will and  
desire is that my Executors pay unto my beloved  
wife Lucretia Delgraffeur Three hundred pounds  
in Gold or silver to be applied by her for the sole  
use and purpose of maintaining and educating her  
Children by me - I also Give unto my beloved wife  
Lucretia my Riding Chair and Carriage forever.  
Item, I Give unto my <sup>said</sup> beloved wife the Land and  
plantation whereon I now live during her natural life,  
which land and plantation is the same heretofore  
Given to my said wife during her life or Widowhood  
by Virtue of a Deed of Trust in which Collette  
Townes her Brother is named as a Trustee and that  
after her decease my will and desire is that the said  
Land be Equally divided between my sons Decharner  
Delgraffeur, and Christopher Delgraffeur forever  
And also Thirty acres of Land adjoining the said Tract  
I purchased of William Robertson which said Thirty

Acres of Land I lend to my said beloved wife during her  
life and after her decease to be divided as aforesaid between  
my said two sons, And in Case I die before the said William  
Robertson makes me a Deed to the said Thirty Acres of Land  
my desire is that he the said William do convey the  
same to my wife for life only, and the Remainder to my said  
two sons forever as aforesaid. - Item I lend unto my said beloved  
wife the following slaves to wit, Simony, Tobb, Robin, Adam,  
Rose and Caesar, Together with her future Increase, during her

Cattle, Fifteen head of Sheep, Fifteen head of Hogs, and three of  
my stock of Horses at her Election, and also all my Household  
and kitchen furniture (Three Beds excepted of the best kind  
with their furniture) Also all my plate of every denomination  
which I have last mentioned slaves together with their future  
increase, stock, furniture, and plate aforesaid, I lend to her  
during her natural life and after her decease to Return to my  
Estate to be disposed of as herein after mentioned; - My  
Will and desire is that the three Beds and furniture  
excepted as above to be given to my Three Youngest daughters  
as they Respectively come of Age or Marry, to wit, One bed  
and furniture to each of my said daughters. -  
Item, I Lend to my said wife One still and Worn during  
her life and after her decease I Give the said still and worn  
to my son William DeGrapparia forever. - Item, I Give  
unto my said beloved wife all the Goods I have imported  
in the Course of Last fall, and now in the house, except  
such as I have already disposed of and burnt, and  
Excepting also the Black wrights I Lend her during  
her widowhood, and upon her death or Marriage, I  
Give the said Black to my son Francis DeGrapparia  
forever.

forever, I also lend unto my said wife during her Widowhood  
the woman, saddle and furniture imported last fall, and  
upon her death or Marriage I Give the said Saddle and  
furniture to my Daughter Catharine Sumner DeGrappin,  
forever. Item, I Give unto my son Christopher DeGrappin  
= said my two steel eads plated with silver, and my Golden  
Medal forever. Item I Give unto my son Wm<sup>o</sup> DeGrappin  
= said my silver watch and Golden ead, Also my new <sup>Saddle</sup> ~~Saddle~~,  
saddle, Cloth, and Bridle forever; -

✓ Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Matruel DeGrappin  
= said five shillings, in full of his share of my estate,  
which said Legacy I Consider as a sufficient consideration  
for any duty I owe him as his father, whom I regretted  
on my Great Care on his tender years, that I cherished  
him as an affectionate father in my bosom, and his  
Extreme disobedience and ingratitude in return in  
insulting and abusing my hoary hairs which are  
almost worn down with age to the Grave, but that  
I forgive him is true and hope God, will forgive  
him. - Item, It is my will and desire that the  
Following Negroes to wit, Big Lucy, Little Lucy, Sarah  
with her Child, Sabinali, Rachel, John Seaver, and Friday,  
with their future increase do remain as they are  
already given to my Three Youngest Children, Lucretia  
Jones DeGrappin, Catharine Sumner DeGrappin, and  
Nancy Medham DeGrappin to them and their heirs  
forever, as by Virtue of a Deed of Gifts Recorded in  
Hampden Court. - Item I lend unto my son Thomas  
DeGrappin, during his natural life Three Negroes  
to wit, Solomon, Roger, and Abby, with their future  
Increase, and upon the Death of the said Thomas

Should he have any child or children lawfully begotten of  
 his body, then and in that case I Give the said three last  
 mentioned Negroes and their future increase to such Child  
 or Children as aforesaid forever, and should my said son  
 Tschanner, have no child as aforesaid, at the time of his  
 death, then and in that case I desire the said three  
 Negroes and their future increase to my two sons, Allen  
 and Christopher DeGrappurid, forever, Item I Give unto  
 my two sons Allen DeGrappurid, and Christopher DeGrapp  
 -urid all my Right and title to a Thousand pounds left  
 in the hands on the Board of Orphans in Switzerland  
 to them and their heirs forever, - My will and desire is  
 that my Executors do annually rent out the Tracts of  
 Land whereon Joseph Peter now lives and pay unto my said  
 son Tschanner, the yearly rent thereof as soon as can be
