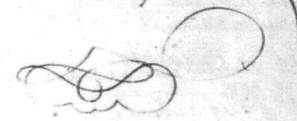

I do give of these, except Ben & Raim, during her natural life, or widowhood, and when she dies or marries the disposal of us underwritten. - I then I desire that the above negroes, ^{Anthony} Ned, ^{Lucy} Suky, Melly, at my mother's death, or marriage, should be sold and the money arising from the sale thereof, should be equally divided between Nancy Gilligan, Dunman, Mary Dunman, Hally's man Dunman, children of Joseph Dunman and his wife, to them and their heirs forever.
