Testament, in the manner and form following To wit:  
I certify. I confirm to my sons Richard C Bacon, Giller  
M Bacon & Syddall Bacon, and to my daughter Polly A B  
Oliver, Sally C Jones - Susannah R Bland, and Marcela Taylor  
all the property I have heretofore given them -  
Item. I give to my son Montfort S Bacon five Negroes to wit,  
Anthony, Lucinda, Little York, Samba, and George, and  
five hundred Dollars in cash, also a Mahogany sideboard  
set of dining table, China cups, six silver spoons and  
ladles, Mahogany case and bottles, and two beds furniture  
and that the said Montfort pay to Syddall Bacon one  
hundred dollars out of his legacy -  
Item. I give to my grandson Edmund P. Bacon son of  
Giller M Bacon a negro boy Stephen.  
Item. I give to my son Richard C Bacon one Negro man  
Heruck - Pay to Bacon Fifty Dollars -  
Item. I give to my son Giller M Bacon one negro man  
Peter, and one bed and furniture -  
Item. I give to sister M Bacon, and Montfort S Bacon in Trust  
for the benefit of my son Young P. Bacon during his life  
the following negroes to wit, Richard, Hannah, Scotland

adler. My hogany. Case and bottles, and two beds furniture  
and that the said Montfort pay to Syddel Bacon one  
hundred dollars out of his legacy -

Item. I give to my grandson Edmund J. Bacon son of  
Gillerall Bacon a negro boy Stephen.

Item. I give to my son Richard C Bacon one negro man  
Heruck. I pay to Bacon thirty Dollars.

Item. I give to my son Giller M. Bacon one negro man  
Peter, and one bed and furnitures.

Item. I give to Giller M. Bacon, and Montford J. Bacon in Trust  
for the benefit of my son Young J. Bacon during his life  
the following negroes, to wit, Richard, Hannah, Scotland

Yearly, also one clock, desk and Book case, bedstead, and  
one bed and furniture, after the death of my son Henry about  
his children die before they ~~arrive~~ age, in that case the  
property to be equally divided among my surviving children  
& to pay to Bacon twenty dollars out of the above -

Item. I give to Giller M. Bacon & Montford J. Bacon  
in Trust for the benefit of my son Edmund J. Bacon during  
his life the following negroes, to wit, Sarah, Mary and Sarah  
and their beds and furnitures, and at his death to be equally  
divided between his children.



Item I give to Eliza M. Bacon & Montford S. Bacon in trust, for the benefit of my daughter Susannah R. Bland children the following negroes to wit: "old York. Sarah. Abram with the increase of Sarah."

Item. I give to my sons Young Henry, & Montford S. Bacon my stock of Horses, Cows, Sheep and Hogs, the balance of my household & kitchen furniture & plantation Tools, to be equally divided between them.

Item It is my will and desire that all the residue of my estate after paying my debts, be equally divided between the children of my daughter Susannah R. Bland.

I do appoint Eliza M. Bacon, and Montford S. Bacon, executors of this my last will and Testament, and that they shall not be required to give security for their executorship, and that no inventory of my estate shall be taken. Given under my hand and seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1825.

In Lunenburg County Court the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1825  
The within written last will and Testament of Edmund P. Bacon dec<sup>d</sup>  
was presented in Court and the same was proved by one of the  
subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the  
motion of Gilbert M. Bacon and Montfort S. Bacon the Executors  
therein named who having made oath according to law Certifi-  
cate is granted them for obtaining probat of said will in due  
form whereupon they entered into an acknowledged bond for that
