Washburn all the property of mine she & Isaac Arnold her husband has in their possession & thirteen dollars in lieu of a saddle to her & her heirs forever -

3rd I give my daughter Mary Burnett all the property of mine she and Philip Burnett her husband has in their possession & a horse which is to be her choice after my wife takes her choice as above & twelve dollars in lieu of a saddle to her & her heirs forever -

4th I give to my daughter Elizabeth & her all the property of mine she & David her husband has in their possession & thirteen dollars in lieu of a saddle & all my Cooper's tools to her & her heirs forever -

5th I give to my daughter Susannah Hightower all the property of mine she & William Hightower her husband has in their possession and thirteen dollars in lieu of a saddle to her & her heirs forever -

6th I leave to my daughter Peggy Andrews during her natural life a negro girl & only one feather bed & furniture one chest one cow & calf

6th I lend to my daughter Peggy Andrews during her marital life
a negro girl scaly one feather bed & furniture one chest one cow & calf
& saddle called hers & one horse her choice after the three horses and
arrows as directed above but provided my daughter Peggy should have
a lawful heir of her body. I give the above negro scaly feather
bed & furniture chest cow & calf saddle & horse to & her heirs forever.
If my above daughter Peggy should have a lawful heir of her
body my will & desire is at her death that my son George Wash-

I leave my legacy that is coming from my father's estate which is now in Tennessee state that I have not before directed otherwise & all my estate that I have not willed off as above to be equally divided between my children Ann H Arnold Martha W Burnett Elizabeth Gee Susanna Hightower Peggy Sissy William & George Washington to them & their heirs forever.
