and testament in manner and form following that is to say - 1st I give and
bequeath to my daughter Sarah Russell ten dollars to be raised out of the
balance of my horses after Polly Will my daughter takes one the first choice
and Nancy and Patsy Will my daughters another the second choice, and the third
that is to say 2nd I have made my daughter Betty during her natural life the
land she has inclosed in a fence and at her death the said land to return into the
lot to be equally divided between my three daughters Nancy, Patsy and
and ten dollars to be raised out of the balance of my horses as above
said - 3rd I give and bequeath the balance of my land to my daughters

stated and my daughter Patsy Will has taken hers as well as stated below and also
as horse the second choice of my stock to be equally divided between them 4th I
give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Will four head of cattle that she has now
in her possession - 5th I give and bequeath my grand daughter Betty Ingram
Will five pounds to be raised out of the balance of my horses as above said
and also one chest that is now in my house and one Pye's heifer -
6th I give and bequeath and bequeath to my Grand daughter Patsy Will thirty
five acres of land to be taken off the plantation where I now live and to include
the house where I now live or any part that she may choose, I also give her
one horse the first choice of my stock and two beds and their furniture and
sells her and the other her daughter Patsy's and also one bed that is now
provided them can be a supply of money raised from the sale of horses

and Nancy and Paddy Hill my daughters another the second choice, and the dollar
that is due me I will lend unto my daughter Betty during her natural life the
land she has inclosed in a fence and at her death the said land to return unto the
do tract to be equally divided between my three daughters Nancy, Paddy Hill
and ten dollars to be raised out of the balance of my horses &c as above
said - 3rd I give and bequeath the balance of my land to my daughters
Nancy and Paddy Hill after my daughter Betty Hill has taken her as above
stated and my daughter Paddy Hill has taken her as well be stated below and also
as horse the second choice of my stock to be equally divided between them 4th I
give and bequeath to my daughter Paddy Hill from head of cattle that she has now
in her possession - 5th I give and bequeath my grand daughter Betty Ingram
Hill five pounds to be taken out of my horses &c as above said
and also one chest that is now in my house and one pig and heifer -
6th I give and bequeath and bequest to my grand daughter Paddy Hill
five acres of land to be taken off the plantation where I now live and to include
the house & outhouses I now live in every part that she may choose, I also give her
one horse the first choice of my stock and two beds and chairs & furniture and
cattle &c and the other her daughter Betsey and also one bed that is mine
provided they can be a sufficiency of money raised from the sale of horses &
collections of debts that I have directed the money to be raised out of
and if not my be it to go to raise the money to pay and all the balance
of my household furniture together with all my the latest furniture &c

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cow and calf and all my stock of hogs except one sow & 8th pigs and hogsheads
to my beloved daughter Charlotte Bell one town also partly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my friends Benjamin Good and Drury Lee Executors of this my last
will and testament hereby revoking all others or former wills or testaments by me
heretofore made - I do Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix
my seal this sixth day of March 1826
