Item I also give unto my beloved wife Betsy Lambert all my house hold & kitchen furniture together with all and every other species of property whatever of which I am in any way possessed making the whole & sole hers to my estate both real & personal. Item I do hereby constitute and appoint it to my wife Betsy Lambert to be the executor of this my last will & Testament. Witness my hand and seal
