1821 I being lawfully of age Barren of limbs and
body of Lunenburg being in good health sound mind and
memory for which I return my most sincere and hearty
thanks to Almighty God and therefore it is ordered for
all men to see to make ordains that this my last will
and testament making and examining all other wills
and bequeaths by me hitherto made nullifying and
confirming this to be my last will and testament in
the manner and the form following—

I Give for the love I bear to my loving wife Elizabeth
See I have ^{Lunenburg County Wills 1818-1826} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} life in widowhood the
following property to-wit, Andrew, Lewis Sarah, Liddy
my and George and I give or bequeaths to her in fee simple
all my stock of Horses except such as are hereafter
mentioned, also my household and kitchen furniture all
my stock of cattle, sheep and Hogs, I moreover give
her during her life or widowhood (as above) that part
of the tract of Land I now live on lying to the
south east of the Spring branch beginning at the creek
where the Spring branch empties into it and thence
up the branch until it gets in a westerly direction with
my house and thence a straight line by a pear tree a
little below the lot containing the mill race to the

my house and thence a creek line by a par tree a
little below Charles Gess house to his line formerly
to happiest line

I Give I give to my daughter Bridget M Gess two
negroes to wit, Malied and Suee two mares and colts
and the cattle and household furniture that she now
has in her possession to her and her heirs forever

I Give I give to my son James S Gess he now lives
on the side of which was made Southly to him
and me two negroes to wit, Bozon and Joney,
one horse cattle and household furniture which
property he has in possession to him and his heirs forever

I Give I give to my son Benjamin Gess two negroes
to wit, Branch and Rose one Bay horse two cows,
calves two pigs and furniture which property he has in
possession to him and his heirs forever

I Give I give unto my daughter Jane Gess two
negroes to wit, Sam and Mary one bed and
furniture and a saddle and bridle which property is
in her possession to her and her heirs forever

I Give I give unto my son Charles Gess the follow-
ing property to wit, Praters and Batts which
are in his possession to gettin unto use the land
and negroes and property of every kind that is

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also the cattle and household furniture that she now
has in her possession. To her and her heirs forever
I then I give to my son James & Lee, he now lives
on the acre of which was made Southly to him
and me two negroes to wit, Bozon and Toney,
one horse cattle and household furniture which
property he has possession of to him and his heirs forever
I then I give to my son Bayman Lee two negroes
to wit, Branch and Rose, one Bay horse two cows,
cattle two pigs and furniture which property he has in
possession to him and his heirs forever.

I then I give unto my daughter Jane Lee two
negroes to wit, Lunenburg County Wills 1818-1826
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furniture and a saddle and bridle which property is
in her possession to her and her heirs forever
I then I give unto my son Robert Lee the following
my property to wit, Praters and Salt which
are in his possession to get the value of the land
and negroes were property of my wife and I
but unto my wife Elizabeth Lee to have possession
of the same cattle to wit, one horse two cows
one calf, one pig, one Bay horse and one cow
I then my wife and I make a deed of

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my sons and daughters viz. Benjamin & Lee, James &
Geo. Benjamin Lee, Jane Lee and Charles Lee bequeathed
and entailed to the increase of the property which is begun
there or given to each of them - My will and desire
is that my sons & daughters be to my executor &

signed sealed in the presence of

Robt. Chappell and

In Summerville (Lunenburg County) Wills 1818-1826 / 1823 The will was written
last will and testament of Isaac Lee and was presented
into court and the same was proved by the oaths of Edw.
Otis and Samuel Lee two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Charles
Lee the executor therein named who having made oath
according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining
probate thereof in due form whereupon he entered into and
acknowledged bond with approved security for such purpose
conditioned as the law directs
