whereof
following to wit: I leave I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hamlett
all things mentioned in a deed of trust to her which is recorded in the
County Court of Lunenburg and one hundred pounds in money which
is in Charles Byrdes hands all of which to do with for her may think
fit - I leave I have given to my daughter Nancy Watson all things
mentioned in my grand fathers will which was bequeathed to me my life
or settled by arbitrators after her intermarriage with a certain
John W. Watson also five dollars in money I leave I give to my
daughter Elizabeth Hamlett the two negroes mentioned in the above
deed trust I leave I give to my son John Clark Hamlett the two negroes
mentioned in the above deed trust also my interest in land in North Carolina
after my mothers death which I have heir to and which land shall be sold
to purchase land elsewhere. This to be a home for his mother as long as
she ~~may~~ remains an widow. Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved
wife Elizabeth Hamlett and my son John Clark Hamlett executor
and executor to this my last will signed with my hand this 8 day of
July 1817
