Winn John In the name of God amen: I John Winn of Lunenburg County do
well make my last will and ~~testament~~ Revoking all other wills heretofore
made by me.

Item it is my will that if my wife Charlotte or her children
or heirs, shall sett up any claim for her interest in the Land she
inherited from her brother John Powell dec^d (that is her part or share
in the tract of Land lying on the Middle meherren River in the
County of Lunenburg it being the tract of Land where Mr Sarah
Powell lived & died) that I have sold my said wife's Charlotte inter-
est in the said Land to ~~Harriett Powell~~ ^{Harriett Powell} and have received full

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satisfaction from my wife Charlotte Interest in the said Tract of
Land, but my wife Charlotte at this time refuses to convey her
right to the said Harriett, and it is my will that if ever my
said wife Charlotte should ever demand, molest or inquiet the
said Harriett Powell or her heirs forever in or from the said Land
that then it is my will and I do hereby subject all my Estate
both real and personal to the payment of the said Harriett Powell
claim or demand including all costs and damages which she the
said Harriett may sustain in consequence of any molestation
by the said Charlotte or who is my person claiming any part

Item the second. My will is that all my Just debts be duly paid & satisfied.

Item the third. If my debts compells my executors to sell any of my Estate to pay the said debts it is my will that the Land and other property I purchased of my brother James Winn where he now lives shall be first sold to pay said debts before any part of my Estate now in my possession. It is hereby fully understood that my will is as to selling of the Land and other property now in possession of my brother James Winn shall be agreeable to an instrument now in the possession of Edmund Winn between us and that if the said James Winn does not pay the several sums of money therein expressed in the ^{above} writing that then the said Land and other property shall be sold and pay the said Claims as mentioned in the ^{above} writing and if any Overplus it shall be paid to said James Winn or his legal Representatives.

Item the fourth. my will is that when my son Charles Winn shall marry he shall be at liberty to settle on one fifth part of my Tract of Land where I now live.

Item the 5th. my will is that John P. Winn shall be at liberty to settle on one fifth part of the Tract of Land I now live on at any time after he marries.

Item the 7th. My will is that George P. Winn shall be at liberty to settle on one fifth part of the Tract of Land I now live on at

Item the 7th My will is that George J. Winn shall be at liberty to settle on one fifth part of the Tract of Land I now live on at any time after he marries.

Item the 8th Joseph A. Winn shall be at liberty to settle on one fifth part of the Tract of Land I now live on at any time after he marries.

Item the 9th My will and desire is that my wife Charlotte Winn shall possess and enjoy the whole of my Tract of Land whereon I now live during her natural life (but she is at liberty to permit my four Boys, Chauncey, John P., George P. and Joseph, to settle on the parts as stated before in this will before marriage if it is agreeable to her permission.)

Item 10th I lend all the rest of my Estate of what kind soever to my wife Charlotte during her natural life, and after her death my will is that there shall be an equal division of my whole Estate both real & personal, to my four sons, Chauncey, John P., George P. and Joseph A. Winn's and their heirs forever.

Item My will ~~and I~~ constitute and appoint David Smith and my sons, four sons Chauncey, John P., George P. and Joseph A. Winn's my executors to this my last will ~~and I~~ ~~and I~~ all other will by me made. In witness whereof I have signed with my hand & seal this 7th day of July 1896.

Item my will and desire is that I constitute and appoint David Smith and my sons, four sons Chauncey, John P., George P. and Joseph A. Winns my executors to this my last will and testament and all other wills by me made - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand real this 7th day of July 1824.

The within written last will and testament of John Winn deceased presented in Court & proved by the oath of one of the witnesses thereto and admitted to be authentic and in accordance with the law

Court, Court the 9th day of January 1826. The said of John Wm
dec^d was again presented in Court & was further forced by the oath
of another of the undersigned to subscribe and order to be recor-
ded. And David Stuart one of the Executors named in the
said will in open Court refused to take upon himself the
burden of the execution thereof. And on the motion of Charlotte Wilson
who having made oath according to law Letters of administration
is granted her with the will annexed and the Estate of the said dec^d
Went. who gave bond with approved security for that purpose
as the Law requires leaving Liberty to the other Executors therein
named to join in payment of said debts as they may think fit
