In the name of God amen Anna & Joseph Bohanan of Lunenburg
County, being sound in body, and in perfect mind and disposing
memory do make constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament
reaching all former Wills by me heretofore made, and as touching what
worldly goods, it has pleased God to bestow me with, I give and dispose
of in manner and form following. (The) First of all it is my desire that
my body should be buried in a decent christian like manner, at the
direction of my dear friends hereafter named. I then I bequeath unto my
loving wife Mary Bohanan all the Tract or parcel of land, wherein I
reside, the same lying and being in the County of Lunenburg, con-
sisting sixty three and two thirds acres, be the same more or less, during her
natural life, and at her death, I give and devise the aforesaid Tract or
parcel of land, to my son Willam Anderson Bohanan to him and
his heirs forever. Lastly I nominate, and appoint my son Willam Anderson
sole Executor, I recite to this my last Will and Testament. Given from
under my hand and seal this Day of November 1806.
