also all money and Debts due me by bond or account, or otherwise
to him, the said William Craghead also everything due of my

their increase to him and his heirs forever -
Thirdly I give to George Craghead, son of William Craghead one
negro man slave by the name of Abraham to him and
his heirs forever - Fourthly and lastly my desire is that
all my wearing clothes be equally divided between the
daughters of my said Brother William Craghead and I appoint
the said William Craghead sole executor to settle all my
affairs of any after my decease - Given from under my hand
and seal this 17 day of August 1832 signed sealed and
acknowledged in the presence of us

to him, the said William Longhead also everything else of my
property (except such as I shall dispose of other ways) with all
their increase to him and his heirs forever - - - -

Thirdly I gave to George Longhead, son of William Longhead, one
negro man slave by the name of Abraham to him and
his heirs forever - Fourthly and lastly my desire is that
all my wearing clothes be equally divided between the
daughters of my said Brother William Longhead and I appoint
the said William Longhead sole executor to settle all my
affairs of any after my decease - Given from under my hand
