old and feeble but in sound mind and memory and knowing it is
appointed for all men once to die, recommending my soul into the hands
of God, who gave it, and my body to be buried in a Christian like
manner, and as touching my worldly estate, which it has been
pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose in the following
manner (Viz) - I give to my beloved wife Anna Wickes one
feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever - I give to
my wife one horse saddle and bridle - I give to my wife two negroes
Fred & Pat during her natural life - I give to my wife one fourth
part of my Cattle, sheep, and hogs during her natural life -
I give to my wife my lands and plantations wherein I now live
during her widowhood. I give it that my two daughters
Cassie Wickes & Susan Wickes have a right for a home on the lands
and plantations lent to my wife as long as they live single -
I give to my daughter Emily Wickes one negro man Jelas to her
and her heirs forever - I give to my daughter Ann Wickes
one negro man Stephen, and one horse to her and her heirs forever -
I give to my daughter Cassie Wickes, one negro boy Lucy, and one
horse and one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever -
I give to my daughter Susan Wickes, one negro boy Rich, one
horse saddle and bridle and one feather bed and furniture and one
cow and calf to her and her heirs forever - I give to my son Rich
Wickes, my still only my wife is to have the use of it whenever she
wants it, to her and her heirs forever - I give to my daughter
Sally Wickes the land and plantations wherein she now lives, I also
give her one negro boy Lucy to her and her heirs forever -

Sally bread the land and plantation wherein she now lives, I also
give her one negro girl, Lucy to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

I have given to my daughter Mary White, fifteen pounds to her &
her heirs forever. - I have my desire is that all my estate not mentioned
be sold and after my just debts is paid my desire that Minor Wickes
deceased children have one sixth part of it, equally divided among
them, and the balance equally divided between my four eldest
children John Wickes, and Thomas Wickes, Richard Wickes, Elizabeth Wickes
Lefty white, to them and their heirs forever.

~~I have my desire is that after my just debts is paid that all my estate both~~
real personal be sold and one sixth part equally divided between my
son Major Wickes deceased children and the balance equally divided
between my five eldest children John Wickes, Thomas Wickes, Richard
Wickes, Elizabeth Wickes, and Lefty White, to them and their heirs forever.

I also constitute and appoint my sons Richard Wickes & Kinneson Foster
Executors to this my last Will and Testament in Wit whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this the tenth day of March 1811 signed
and sealed in the presence of -

Witnessed and signed at D. C. Sep. 1811. The within last Will & Testament
of Minor Wickes deceased was presented in Court by the Executors therein named
and the same was perused by the Court of one of the Judges of said Court and
declared not to be fraudulent. And on the motion of the said Executors
who having made oath according to law and before is granted a decree for
the same probate of the same and that as the same from the said Court
and be the same with effect and same as if the same were the same.
