I, Nathan August 28th 1819 In the Name of God amen I Nathan Potts of the County
of Lunenburg and State of Virginia being of a sound and composed mind do make
this my last will and testament, and make the following distribution of my property
1st Item I bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Potts the possession and right of
my land on which I now live with all her debts and desire that my daughters
Katherine and Sally Potts and son William Potts do continue on said land until
their deaths but should both of my daughters marry before or after the death of my
wife Elizabeth Potts (or should not marry them at their death) I bequeath unto
my son John Potts the said land to him and to his heirs forever and desire that my
son John Potts do live on the said land from this time if he thinks proper
2nd Item I bequeath unto my son William Potts and John Potts and my daughter
Katherine & Sally Potts Lunenburg County Wills 1818-1828
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forever 3rd Item I bequeath unto my son William Potts my bay horse which
he has or did have in possession and which heifer of my cattle and arsons and
lamb from among my flock of sheep to have and to hold on his forever
4th Item I bequeath unto my son John Potts a cow and calf which he
now has in possession and a ewe and lamb from among my flock of sheep
5th Item Now I bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Potts the residue of
my property consisting of more or less of a parcel of land sheep large plantation
utensils house hold and kitchen furniture and any other contents to have
and to hold as she thinks proper
6th Item I will and desire that my leg pay, interest and to
pay on debt and that the said debt be paid to me or of

the bottles or sheep or such property as may seem most expedient

In Lunenburg County Court 12th November 1826 The last will and
Testament of William Potts deceased was presented into court and the same was
proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto subscribed and ordered to
be recorded in appearing to the satisfaction from the said two witnesses that
the said will the not signed by the Testator that the said Testator was in of
sound mind and memory and that at his request they subscribed their
names as witnesses to the same - and by the motions of Elizabeth Potts
widow and next of kin of the deceased who having made oath accor-
-ding to law Certificate is granted here for obtaining probate of the said will and
which is due formal whereupon she gave bond with security for that purpose
conditioned as the law directs
