I M the name of God almighty I Peter Jones doe of Lunenburg  
County; professing sound health and memory do make and Ordaine this  
my last will & testament - Inasmuch as after the payment of just debts I  
desire of my late both real & personal in the following manner to set them  
at the slaves, lands and other property which I have heretofore given away of my  
chancery, I do command and give them and their descendants them to go to  
Lugard his wife and his son, my plantation by you known as Upper Creek.  
I do also command all the lands given by the name of Peter Jones to my  
slaves I purchased of the late Mr. James Edwards to him & his son

I have also give and bequeath to my said son Edmund all those the  
following negroes to wife Marriah, Betty, Delia, Lucy, Melody, and  
eldest including the income of the females to him and his heirs forever  
Item I also give and bequeath to my said son Edmund the sum of one  
further feather bed and feather, the sum of ~~one hundred dollars~~<sup>one hundred</sup> dollars  
and the sum of twenty four bushels of corn to him and his heirs forever  
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna Jones the following  
negroes to wife Keene, Hamilton, Rose, Tommy, and her two children,

Patsey & Sally and Lovelace, including the future income of the  
females to her and her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my  
said Daughter Susanna Jones his feather Bed & furniture, and a  
horse bridle and Saddle to her and her heirs forever Item I give and  
bequeath to my daughter Anna J. Jones, the following negroes to wife John  
Settle George, Anne, Millie, Frederick & Henry, children of Anna, and  
Amy, including the future income of the females to her and her heirs  
forever Item I give and bequeath to my said daughter Anna J. Jones two  
feather Beds & furniture and one horse saddle and bridle to her and  
her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Francis J.  
Jones the following negroes to wife Edmund, Aaron, Barney, Silvia and

death of my said wife, I give and bequeath to be equally divided among my three daughters to wit Lissanna Jones, Edmund Jones and Frances J. Jones to them and their heirs forever Item I give and

bequeath the negro and their future increase but

bequeath to my granddaughter Martha & Tolerton, a negro girl named Anna  
and her increase to her and her heirs forever I give and bequeath to  
my daughter Sally Cralle, wife of Richard H. Cralle two hundred pounds  
current money in consideration of any debts due, or demands which he  
now has or may in future have against me either by bond or other  
accords, and further of making Legacy equal to the rest of my daughters  
to her and her's place after the residue of my estate both real and  
personal not heretofore given or bequeathed to her and bequeath to my  
wife Jane Jones during her natural life from the back of land above  
on I now live together with all my land inheritance given or be-  
queathed, and which I do give back to my wife Jane Jones after the  
death of my said wife I give and bequeath to be equally divided am-  
ongst my three daughters to wit Elizabeth Jones, Anna Jones, and Frances  
Jones to them and their heirs forever I give and  
bequeath the negro and their future increase before last to my  
wife Jane Jones at her death to be equally divided amongst  
my nine children to wit Branch Jones, Hunting Jones, Sally  
Jones, Peter Jones, Elizabedt stay boy, Juanna Jones, Maria Jones

I have the two hundred pounds herein bequeathed to my daughter Sally Jones  
wife of Richard Beale is not to be paid her till she can conveniently raise  
by my executors after the death of my said wife Jane Jones I desire that  
there be no appraisement of my Estate and I do hereby appoint my sons Ben-  
jamin Jones & Edward the late Jones and John Taylor Executors to this my  
last Will & Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of December 1813
