Will County being sick and weak, but of sound mind and memory
do make ordain constitute this my last will and testament
revoking all other wills by me made as followeth:—
Item 1st I direct that all my Just debts should be ^{first} paid.
Item 2^d I lend unto my loving mother Susanna Winn during
her natural life all my household furniture. I also lend to my said
mother Susanna Winn, my three Slaves, Jack, Gray, & Isaac,
until the said Slaves shall each arrive to the age of sixteen years
each respectively. Jack, was born on the 30th day of June 1813,
Gray, was born the 9th day of July 1815, and Isaac was born
the 30th August 1817. It is my desire when the said three Slaves
are sixteen years old that they then be bound out by my
Executors hereafter named to some respectable person or persons to
learn the Trades of Shoe makers or Blacksmiths or some good
trade as may be best judged of by my said Executors, that will
promote them in this world, and my Executors are to keep
funds of any part of my Estate, to carry the said Negroes where
they may go.

Item 3^d It is my will & most sincere desire that my said
Slaves, Jack, Gray & Isaac, when they shall arrive to the age of
twenty one years, shall have their Freedom & never more be in
bondage to any person or persons whatsoever. It is also my

Item 3. It is my will & most sincere desire that my said
Slaves, Sack, Guy & Isaac, when they shall arrive to the age of
twenty one years, shall have their Freedom & never more be in
bondage to any person or persons whatsoever. It is also my
will that the above named slaves shall have out of the
legacy that my father John Winn wills to me after my mother's
death to bear the said three negro slaves expenses & ~~and~~
other expenses as may be necessary to send them to some free
State as they may choose to go to.

Item 4th. The Tract of Land whereon my mother Susanna Winn
now lives on, which my father John Winn wills to me
at the death of my ~~mother~~ ^{mother} at her death I give two acres
of the Tract of Land to the disciples of God called and known
by the name of the methodists to build a meeting house or for
the only use of preaching the everlasting Gospel of unbounded
free Grace. I also give timber off any part of the said tract
to build the said meeting house and also twenty
dollars towards paying the workmen that may build the said
meeting house it is my will that the said two acres of land
or more may be laid off where it will best interfere with
the balance of the said tract of land as what there may
be under the said to the said meeting house.

Item 5. It is my will and desire that one half acre of the land that my father bequeathed me after my mother's death in the apple orchard where my father is buried shall be set a part of Burialling Ground for the family in General and for other use & whatever -

Item 6. I lend all the balance of the tract of Land which my father John Winn will^d me after the death of my mother Susanna Winn, to James S. Brown during his natural life, and if the said James S. Brown never marry miss Ann Brown, daughter of Jefe Brown then I give the said tract of Land to him this heirs forever, but if the S. James S. Brown does marry ~~any other woman~~ ^{any other woman} as aforesaid then at his death I give the aforesaid Tract of Land to my two nephews John P. Winn and John C. Winn and their heirs forever

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Item 7. I give all my interest in the negroes that my father left me to be received at the death of my mother Susanna Winn after complying with the demands of my father will & my own, I desire may be equally divided in two parts, and one half to be equally divided between the children of my brother John Winn and the other the half between my brother James Means children and their heirs forever.

Item 8. at the death or pleasure of my mother Susanna Winn I give to my niece Sally A. Winn one acre and a half of land

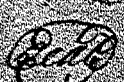
Item 8th at the death or pleasure of my mother Susanne Winn

Item 9th all the rest of my household furniture (except my best
walnut chest & eagle Bed quilt) I desire may be equally divided

heirs forever.

Item 10th I give my best walnut chest and my eagle bed quilt to
my Cousin Eliza E Winn daughter of Oenamas Winn dec^d and
her heirs forever.
