Item I give devise & bequeath to George Craig & Allen Stokes my negro woman Rachel & all her children except Mary to hold the same in Trust for the benefit & to the use of my niece Fannetta Craig until she is of age & then to be delivered by them to her to hold the same to her & her heirs forever. ~ ~ ~

during their infancy or until their marriage & then to be equally
divided between them my said Nieces to them & their heirs forever.

It is my desire & intention that on the marriage or arriving to age of
each or either of my said nieces, the one so marrying or arriving to age
to be entitled to receive their part or portion of this their legacy
but should either of my said nieces die under age or unmarried then

the property so devised to them to be held by the said Trustees for
 the use & benefit of the remaining said children of my said late niece.
 Lastly I constitute & appoint my Nephews George Gray & Allen Stokes

 with entire land with approved security for that purpose
 constituted as the law directs
