And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my friends Silvanus Ingram James Fisher & my brother William Calineff my executors to this my will & Testament, & should any section of my will bear more than one construction my executors by majority will decide the point without suffering the matter to approach the court and at my residence at Hottorway River the 3rd day of August one thousand eight hundred & twenty is attested my

the said will in due form whereupon he gave bond & security
for that purpose conditioned as the law directs reserving liberty to the
other executors therein named to join in probate when they shall think fit
