Booker, Ann & Peter, one horse saddle & bridle one bed, bedstead &
furniture two cows & calves one bureau & ten pounds in cash the
Bureau saddle bridle she has received.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Loretta three negroes
named Abby, Gabriel & Jack one horse saddle & bridle one bed, bedstead &
furniture two cows & calves & twenty pounds in cash.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Lucia three negroes
named Henry, Merced & Lucy one horse saddle & bridle one
bed, bedstead & furniture two cows & calves & twenty pounds in cash.

Item I give, ^{& bequeath} unto my daughter Fanny four negroes named Joel,
Meriah, Rabbie & Archer & twenty pounds in cash and money to
be raised out of my estate to give her a good education. I give
unto my son James two negroes named Reaton & Mate, Lekeia

unto my son James two negroes named Wadron & Mary, and
to receive Dickey & her child his own negroes now in my possession
are to be received next fall. Likewise one horse two cows &
calves one bed bedsteads & furniture two rows of higgs & one pine
chest to be received next fall also the tract of land I
purchased of Sheltons executors which he will receive after my
wifes decease. I lend unto my beloved wife nine negroes named
Mary, Charles, Buster, Dick, John, Sam, Samney, Betty & Marmy
together with the stock of all kinds Plantation utensils household
of kitchen furniture, gig & harness & farm mill, the crop that may
be growing or may be made that year I give her to do what
she pleases with it, & after her death for every thing I lend to
her to be equally divided among all my children except the
land which I intend to be divided among all my daughters likewise
the lands the land that may fall to me after the death of Elsie
Jeffrey where he now lives to my desire for it to be equally
divided among all my children - it is also to be understood
that I do expect that my son Jennings & my daughter Lurinda
will fall heir to one third of their grand fathers land, in Ramsey
county & if it should be the case to the amount of one thousand
dollars each there are to receive no more of my estate than what I
have already given them & if they should not get it then in that
case my desire is for them to receive what I have mentioned above. I con-
stitute & appoint my sons Jennings & James Jeffrey executors to this my last
