In the name of God Amen I Thomas Jones of the County of Lunenburg and State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory Thanks be to almighty God for the same do make and Publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner and form following (to wit) first I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Lucy, well, Indef man, & their Children to have & to hold the said slaves during life or Widowhood & her death to be equally divided between my Children, Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Margaret Jones One negro man by name John & a negro woman named Sarah & her future increase also a bed and furniture, Two Chests at present Called () Two wheels a linen and a Cotton wheel; to have and hold the said property forever I do give to my daughter Mary Nagdale sixty pounds to be paid as soon as my exors can pay the same my without delay, which sum my exors will pay to the said daughter on her particular Order which sum she is to

 give my son Thomas a bed and furniture. I lend my daughter
 Rebecca Andrews, one negro man named Frank called
 Smith whose labour is to be applied to the support of her
 and her children, which negro is not to be taken by any
 legal process and sold or hired out to pay any debt that her
 husband Alexander Andrews marry or shall have contracted
 & but if any process should take place he shall be demanded and
 received by my son or one of them or their executors or assigns
 and disposed of so that the intent and meaning of my
 loan be fulfilled. I do give to my daughter Martha one
 negro woman named Betty & her daughter named Willa and
 their increase to her and her heirs forever also two Chests called
 a bed and furniture, and my flock of Geese. I do
 give to my daughter Arny Bette Jones one negro man by
 name Sham and a girl by name Fanny and her increase &
 a bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever and lastly I

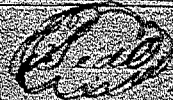
bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever and lastly I give to my son William Jones a negro man named James or black smith & a negro girl by name Maria and her increase a bay mare called doe, a bed and furniture and also my black smiths tools to him and hers forever my crop of 1804 made in the year 1804 and the present growing crop of 1804 or if there should be any surplus product after supporting my family it is my will and desire should be applied to the payment of a bond given to Mary Vaughan and two small bonds to Robert Alderson of cancelled from John H Trout to my son Thomas Jones to the payment of such debts and other debts that I may be owing it is my desire that the shop accounts may be applied and labouring to continue together untill discharged as also a bond given by my son William to Baxter & Miles Jordan be it remembered that if either of my children or either her bonds or heirs should be dissatisfied at the sale of a negro girl named Sarasa sold by me that for such contention they shall

forfeite their stated legacy and shall be equally divided
between the rest of my legates: The p^ro^per to that I have
not mentioned in this my Last Will & Testament is to
continue in the p^resentation for the benefit of my family
and my heirs and their heirs to continue together

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all not before mentioned is to be equally divided between my two sons
Thomas & William and it is my desire there should be no appeal
I think I do appoint my two sons Thomas & William executors, with
out the necessity of security and, revoke all former Wills by me made
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
seal this 24 day of September 1808.
