Will

In the name of God Amen, be it remembered that I this
Jordan Jr. of Lincolnburg County W Va being weak in body but of sound
perfect mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this
mortal life do make and Ordain this to be my last Will
& Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made in the
first place then my Will and desire is that my Kentucky
& Holston Land be sold by my exec hereafter named for the pay-
ment of all my debts to the said exec I leave with my son
John the land on my home place plantation with all the
negroes, money, debts and all the stock, household furniture

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for mine & plantation utensils on the said plantation also one negro man
 named Frank to be taken from my Mill plantation during his natu-
 ral life and after her death to be equally divided among all my children
 except Truman Jordan & his heirs & I give and bequeath to my son Truman
 Jordan one dollar to him & his heirs forever then I bind unto
 Thomas Jordan I & John Willson as trustees for the benefit of my
 son Truman Jordan and his wife Elizabeth during the lifetime
 in life my mill plantation in Westway City and one equal part of the
 negroes stock household & kitchen furniture with all my other children
 after the death of my wife Elizabeth Jordan and after the death of the said
 Truman Jordan the land to be equally divided between his two sons
 Thomas W Jordan & Charles Jordan to them & their heirs forever and
 after the death of Truman Jordan the said negroes, stock household
 & kitchen furniture plantation utensils to be equally divided among all
 his children to them & their heirs forever and the said Thomas Jordan
 I and John Willson as trustees to hold the property and to lend it unto
 him as they may see cause for the support of his wife and children
 I give and bequeath unto my son James Jordan the plan-

him as they may see cause for the support of his
Itern & I do also give and bequeth unto my son James Jordan the plan-
tation wherein he now lives also the plantation adjoining him called
(Upson) also fifty pounds to be paid him by my son Thomas Jordan per
at the expiration of two years after my death to him & his heirs forever
Item I do also give & bequeth unto my son Thomas Jordan for the two
tracks of Land lying in Lunenburg County where he lives called Rays &
Scotts except the lower body of low grounds on Rays track, my wish &
desire is that my beloved wife Elizabeth Jordan shall have the use of the
low grounds aforesaid during her natural life and after her death to go to my
son Thomas Jordan her together with one half of all my little live lands
and thirty acres of down land adjoining to him, also all other property
whatsoever I have heretofore given to him and his heirs forever & I give
and bequeth unto my son Bernard Jordan for the home house plantation
after the death of my beloved wife Elizabeth also ten negroes to be taken from
(Upson) place or plantation called by that name and in stock & household
furniture to be made equal to my two sons that are settled what I give
to him & to his heirs forever & I give & bequeth unto my daughter Polly

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I have I do also give & bequeath unto my son
Trach of Land lying in Lennelburg County where he lives called Rays &
Scotts except the lower body of low grounds a Rays track, my wish &
desire is that my beloved wife Elizabeth Jordan shall have the use of the
low grounds aforesaid during her natural life and after her death to go to my
son Thomas Jordan her together with one half on all my little one hundred
and thirty acres of lower land adjoining to him, also all their property -
whatsoever I have heretofore given to him and his heirs forever I give
and bequeath unto my son Thomas and Jordan for the home house plantation
after the death of my wife Elizabeth also to my request to be taken from
My place a plantation called by that name and in stock & household
furniture to be made good to my three sons that are settled which I give
to him & to his heirs forever I give & bequeath unto my daughter Polly
& Jordan one half of my track of land in Lennelburg County called
the hundred Creek plantation also to my request to be taken from the
Mill plantation also half of the home plantation also stock &
household furniture to be good to my daughter Elizabeth & her

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settled to her & her heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Elizabeth B. Tuckan One half of my hundred Creek plantation in
Lunenburg County also all the property I have heretofore given her
to her and her heirs forever. And lastly I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth
& Jordan one little negro girl about her age to be taken from
the part allotted to Truman Jordan. I give & bequeath unto
May & Ann Jordan one little negro girl about her age to be taken
from the part allotted to Truman Jordan. I to her and her heirs forever.
My will and desire is that all my other property not allotted
any after my last will and testament be equally divided among all my
children except Truman Jordan & and unequal parts unto my other
children. I have unto them and their heirs forever and their children as trustees
for the benefit of my said son Truman Jordan & his wife & chil-
dren and after the death of my said son Truman and his wife
death or widowhood, and after the death of my said son Truman
the trustees are to divide the property between his children equally to
be theirs & their heirs forever. Lastly I appoint my son Truman
Jordan & my friend John Wilkerson my executors to this my
last will and testament.
