& Testament

I give all the property I have heretofore given to any of my children I do
hereby confirm such gift to them & their heirs forever.

I give to my beloved wife Rebecca Ann Hatchett I give & bequeath to herself
& her heirs forever the following property which I got by her self one
negroe man Joe & one negroe woman written with her future increase
also one feather bed & furniture one Bed room & one chest - I also leave to
my said wife & her heirs forever my Ligg & Harness, one horse worth one
hundred & fifty dollars Lunenburg County Wills 1818-1826

that may be on hand at my decease - also one fifth part of the crop
made at my home plantations, the year of my decease - I also leave to my said
wife during her natural life - all the tract of Land I reside & on & adjoin-
ing thereto (except the tract of Land purchased of Geo Jones) with this reserva-
tion however - that the Land now standing in woods lying north of where
I reside (I burn down by, & lying in the forks of the two roads near the gate
called Geo Jones gate one, leading towards ^{Lunenburg Court house & the other leading} George Hatchetts mill) is not to be
cleared nor felled of timber during the term of such Loan as above, I also

leave my said wife during her natural life the following Slaves with their
future increase of the females Vep, Home, Jesse, Delphy, Mary, Emock,
Eliza, Stephen, Rhoda, her two children (Randolph & Martha) & Nancy
also my home still one yoke of oxen one ore cart, one fifth part of my

Oliver, Stephen, Rebecca, her two children Randolph & Martha & Nancy -
also my home still one yoke of Oxen one ox cart, one fifth part of my
stock of every description horse hold kitchen furniture & plantation utensils
Item the Lands I purchased of Thomas Winn, Isaac May & James
McDoughlin adjoining the land of Alexander Winn & others. I will & do
divide between my two sons Maynie Hatchett & George Hatchett in the
following manner. Viz. all the land on the south side of the present
road now leading from Alexander Winn's old shop to Lunenburg court
house, I give & bequeath to my son Maynie Hatchett & his heirs forever
all the land lying on the north side of said road I give & bequeath
to my son George Hatchett & his heirs forever.

Item To my son Maynie Hatchett & his heirs forever I give & bequeath
the following slaves Lunenburg County Wills 1818-1826
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Moses, Aaron, Minner, Siller, & Emanuel. & at the death of my said
son her future increase & sum.

Item I lend to my daughter Nancy Grallee during her natural life the
following slaves (with the future increase of the females) viz. Daniel, Corn
Moses, Aaron, Minner, Siller, & Emanuel. & at the death of my said
daughter my will & desire is that all the slaves lent her as above
with the future increase of the females be equally divided among all her
children provided they arrive at full age or marry & not otherwise;

Item to my son George Hatchett & his heirs forever I give & bequeath the
following slaves with the future increase of the females) viz. Harry quarter
Befor, his wife Sally and Hall;

I am provision my Grand daughter Elizabeth Anne Blackwell married
to John Blackwell (my son-in-law) I give & bequeath to her &

Item to my son George Hatchett & his heirs forever I give & bequeath the
following slaves with the future increase of the females viz. Harry, quarter
Teece, his wife Sally and Hall;

Item I provide my Grand daughter Elizabeth Anne Black with
Lawful age or marriage (& not other wise) I give & bequeath to her &
her heirs forever the following property viz. all that tract of Land
I lately purchased of Gen. Scott containing six hundred & seventy rods
more or less the same more or less as the survey shall show with the
future increase of the females viz. Daniel, Moses & Ann his

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wife & her three children (Mancy Ambros & Easter) Klamm & her three
children (Baker, Cammel & Mary) West, Peter, P. Cy, Polly, Bob,
Leah (Allen & Eliza) (children of Mary) also one further line & furniture
I turn to my Grand son George Wallace & his heirs forever. I give
to give & bequeath one negro boy named Thompson which is now
in his possession also five hundred dollars cash.

I turn to my Grand son George Archer Wallace & his heirs forever. I
give & bequeath one negro boy named Will which he has now in his
possession also five hundred dollars in cash.

I turn to my Grand son George Craighead Hatchett & his heirs forever.
I give & bequeath one negro boy named Lewis which he now has in
possession.

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I turn to my Grand Daughter Petronella Hatchett & her heirs forever.
I give & bequeath one negro girl named Patience.

I turn to my Grand daughter Mary Elizabeth Hatchett & her heirs forever.
I give & bequeath one negro girl named Ettilon.

I turn to my Grand son Wm Wayne Hatchett & his heirs forever. I give &
bequeath one negro boy named Spencer.

I turn to my Grand Daughter Jane Maria Hatchett & her heirs forever.
I give & bequeath one negro girl named Betty (daughter of Kitty).

I turn to my Grand son Branch Archer Hatchett & his heirs forever. I
give & bequeath one negro boy named Washington.

I turn my still now in possession of my son George Hatchett I give

I am my still now in possession of my son George Hatchett I give
to him my said son & his heirs forever
Item upon the decease of my wife Rebecca Ann Hatchett it is my will
and desire that all the property both real & personal including the
interest of sales &c) loaned her during her life be sold by my executors
hereinafter named on such credit as they may think most
adviseable not exceeding however two years & the money arising
therefrom divided into five equal parts & applied as follows Viz
To my son Wayne Hatchett I give one such part, to my daughter
Nancy Gruller I give one such part, To the children
of my deceased son Archer Hatchett I give one such part, To my
son George Hatchett I give one such part, To my Grand
Daughter Elizabeth Wayne Blackwell & her heirs I give one such
part. I leave all the rest & residue of my estate not disposed of
in manner aforesaid in whatsoever consisting I desire may be sold
by my executors on a credit of twelve months & the money arising
therefrom together with all the one & money on hand be equally
divided into five parts & distributed exactly in the same manner
as the rest Item above permit out.
The property I have given my wife Rebecca Ann Hatchett during
her life it is in lieu of her dower in my estate.
I appoint my two sons Wayne Hatchett & George Hatchett Trustees
to take on charge & manage the estate heretofore devised to my
Grand daughter Elizabeth Wayne Blackwell until she

hereinafter named in such exact as they may think most
convenient (not exceeding however two years) & the money arising
therefrom divided into five equal parts & applied as follows. To
my son Maymie Hatchett I give one such part, to my daughter
Nancy Gruller & her heirs I give one such part, to the children
of my deceased son Archer Hatchett I give one such part, to my
son George Hatchett & his heirs I give one such part, to my Grand
Daughter Elizabeth Maymie Blackwell & her heirs I give one such
part. I term all the rent & revenue of my estate not disposed of
in manner aforesaid in whatsoever consisting, I desire may be paid
by my executors in a exact of twelve months & the money arising
therefrom together with all to me one & money on hand be equally
divided into five parts & distributed exactly in the same manner
as the next item above point out.

The property I have given my wife Rebecca Ann Hatchett during
her life is in full of her share in my estate.
I appoint my two sons Maymie Hatchett & George Hatchett Trustees
to take in charge & manage the estate heretofore devised to my
Grand daughter Elizabeth Maymie Blackwell until she
comes of lawful age or marries but in the event if her
not surviving to either of these events it is my will &
I name the estate under her both rent & revenue should be paid
in a exact of twelve months & the money arising therefrom

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be ~~divided~~ into four equal parts & distributed as follows: Vith one fourth part to my son Haynes Hatchett & his heirs forever, one fourth to my daughter Marney Grace & her heirs forever, one fourth part to the children of my deceased son Ascher Hatchett & their heirs forever & fourth part to my son George Hatchett & his heirs forever.

Lastly, I constitute & appoint my two sons Haynes Hatchett & George Hatchett executors to this my last will & testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 16th day of August one thousand eight hundred & twenty one
