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In the name of God, amen William Tatum of Lunenburg
County and State of Virginia, being weak in body, but of sound mind
and memory do make, and ordain, this my last Will & Testament
In the first place I will and direct, that such part of my estate (at the
discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned), be sold for the payment
of my just debts. 2^{ndly} I will and direct that the balance of my estate
feared disipation, be kept together for the common support & education
of my family, now with me - and that each of my children now
unmarried both sons and daughters as they become of age or marriage
receive a horse saddle and bridle and a bed and furniture, and cow
and calf of as equal value as possible. 3^{rdly} I will and direct to my
youngest daughter, Mary a separate legacy of fifty dollars when
she arrives of age or marriage. 4^{thly} I will and direct, that my
children, as aforesaid receive and be under the care and control
of my said wife Mary (who is to enjoy in common with them
the profits of my estate kept together as aforesaid) during her nat-
ural life, or widowhood, and when either of those periods last men-
tioned arrives I will and direct that the said then on hand be
equally divided between my children then unmarried & with her
said wife Mary do make of my estate of my own disposition, not
impaired by her said bequest, my several children (not
surviving or under full age) being then living & then dead.
