In the name of God Amen I William Williams of the County
 of Henricburg being of sound mind and disposing memory and
 calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form following To wit
 I bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Williams during her widowhood the
 tract of land whereon I now live including the land & orchard of
 Thomas & John & John & Joseph Williams and Samuel Williams
 containing by estimation six hundred and sixty six acres, she allowing
 to my children the liberty of working the uncultivated regions upon the
 said land. I bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Williams during her
 widowhood the following slaves with their future increase viz Stephen
 John Will. Frederick ^{Lunenburg County Wm} and their two children Ned & Maria, Leahy
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 George and her two children (see www.virginiapioneers.net) and Dick, Fanny & her child
 Elizabeth & Molly, Young Nanny and young George also all my house-
 hold and kitchen furniture not hereafter specially devised, also all my
 stock of every description not hereafter specially devised.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Susan Williams her
 heirs executors and assigns one negro girl named Jerry with her future
 increase upon condition that she pay to my daughter Eliza Williams
 when she arrives to lawfull age or marries one hundred dollars.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Williams one negro
 girl named Tabb with her future increase to her and her heirs forever
 and at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Mary Williams I give
 to my said daughter Eliza Williams my chest of drawers

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and at the death or marriage of my beloved wife, Mary Williams, I give
to my said daughter Eliza Williams, my chest of drawers.
I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Williams, when he arrives
at lawfull age or marriage, one half of the tract of land, I purchased of
Jacobusack Hunt containing by estimation 80 acres to be divided
agreeable to quality and quantity to him, and his heirs forever. I also
give to my said son Samuel Williams, his heirs executors & admors, one
negro boy called Ned son of Harry.
I give and bequeath to my son William Williams, when he arrives
at lawfull age or marriage, the other half of my said tract of land I pur-
chased of Jacobusack Hunt to him, and his heirs forever. I also give &
bequeath to my said son William Williams, his heirs executors &
admors, one negro boy called Rhody son of Rhody.
I give and bequeath to my son John Freeman Williams, and Joseph
Williams, at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Mary Williams
all the tract of land I have lent to my said wife, to be equally divided
between them equally to quality and quantity, according to my said
son Joseph Williams, the mansion house which I give to them & their
heirs forever.
I give and bequeath to my son John Freeman Will-
iams his heirs executors & admors one negro boy called Jack son of Sally.
I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Williams, his heirs executors
and admors one negro boy called George son of Sally.
I give and bequeath to my daughter Catharine Williams, her heirs
executors & admors one negro girl named Liza with her furniture
clothes.

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I give and

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I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Williams her share and admors one negro girl named Phoebe with her future increase. It is my will and desire that if my Catharine that my beloved wife is now pregnant with should be a son my four sons James Williams, William Williams, John Frederick Williams & Joseph Williams pay to him when he arrives to lawfull age or marrys one hundred pounds each current money of Virginia, and the legacies left to my said four sons is left them on condition that they respectfully comply with this request. I also gave to my Posthumous child if a son one negro boy named Glasgow but if a daughter one negro girl named Abigail with her future increase. It is my will and desire that if any of my sons should depart this life before they arrive at lawfull age or marry that their portion of land that I have bequeathed to them shall be equally divided among the survivors of my sons & their executors and admors. It is my will and desire that when any of my children arrives at lawfull age or marrys that they shall receive from my estate one good feather bed and furniture. It is my will and desire that when any of my sons arrives at lawfull age or marrys that they receive out of my estate one good horse, and the one fifth part of my stock of cattle hogs & sheep. It is my will and desire that when any of my daughters shall arrive at lawfull age or marrys that my executors purchase them out of my money bequeathed to my estate a chest of drawers including my Posthumous child if a daughter, and excepting my daughter Sloze Williams. It is my will and desire that at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Mary Williams that all my stock of cattle hogs & sheep not heretofore specially devised, and all my household and kitchen furniture, not heretofore specially devised be equally divided among all my sons including

my posthumous child if a son, the balance of all the property of every ac-
ception lent to my beloved wife and not lawfully specially devised
shall at the death or marriage of my beloved wife to be equally divided
among all my children including my posthumous child to them and
their heirs forever. It is my will and desire that all my property of
every description not lent to my beloved wife or her heirs specially devised
be divided among all my children including my posthumous child
in the following manner (First) That it be kept together and worked upon
my two tract of land, for the support and education of my children
and as they arrive at lawfull age or marrys to receive their portion; &
the balance to be kept together as above until my youngest child
arrive at lawfull age or marry, & then it is my will and desire that my
said balance be lent to my brother David G. Williams the lot of land purchased
of my brother Joseph G. Williams containing by estimation fifty acres pro-
vided my said brother David G. Williams purchased & conveyed to my son
the lot of land my sister Ann Williams drew at the division of the
said lot belonging to the estate of Catherine Williams and which land of
my said brother David G. Williams purchased & conveyed to my son
of Joseph Williams. — It is my will and desire that if my executor or
hereafter named, may think at any time hereafter that it will be for the
interest of my estate to sell two negro slaves belonging to my said estate
(to wit) John & Betty they are hereby authorized to dispose of them in any
way they may think most advantageous which sale by their parents shall
be binding and the proceeds of the sale shall be my executor shall be obligated to

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be divided among all my children, in the following manner (Viz) That it be kept together and worked upon my two tract of land, for the support and education of my children and as they arrive at lawfull age or marrys to receive their portion; & the balance to be kept together, as above until my youngest child arrives at lawfull age or marrys. - It is my will and desire that my ~~dearest~~ convey to my brother David G. Williams the lot of land purchased of my brother Joseph G. Williams containing by estimation fifty acres, proved my said brother David G. Williams purchased & conveyed to my son the lot of land my sister Anne R. Williams drew at the division of the land belonging to the estate of Catherine Williams dec'd which land of a conveyed place in the same manner, that she has left the land purchased of Joseph Williams. - ^{Lunenburg Court Wills} ¹⁸¹⁰⁻¹⁸¹³ ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} It is my will and desire that if my executor hereafter named, may think at any time hereafter that it will be for the interest of my estate to sell two negro slaves belonging to my said estate (to wit) Boris & Betty, they are hereby authorized to dispose of them in any way they may think most ~~advantage~~ which sale by their present shall be binding, and the title made by my executor shall be obligatory on my said estate. It is my will and desire that shall be reappearing my estate - I have made and appear my to my David G. Williams and Joseph G. Williams and my friend Lewis Jones witnesses of this my last will and testament following whereof I have subscribed at my hand and signed my name on the 13th day of February 1813 signed sealed & published in presence of W. H. Williams & W. H. Williams
