Item I lent to my beloved wife

my wife is now living with and the
hundred acres of land whereon my
Brother James Triffin formerly live
I give and bequeath to my son James
Triffin (as next line illegible) James
Triffin three hundred seventy nine acres
of land that George Tindon bought of
John Potter provided that John Pusey does
not pay more John Potter seven hundred
pounds or more shillings current money

of Virginia on or before the twentieth day of
December next and if the said Birley pays to
John Potter the said money and brings my bond on
or before the twenty fifth day of December next
then my executor shall make him a deed to
the said land

And I do hereby nominate & appoint
John Jones and Robert Jones & Richd. Jones my
— sole Executors of this my last will and
testament revoking and making void all other
wills and testaments that ever before made

therein named to join in probate with the said
John when he shall think fit.
