In the presence of the Hon. George H. H. H. of the County
of Mecklenburg being of sound mind and memory do make my
last will as follows:— It is my desire that my executor
hereafter named make sale of my part of the land where
Isaac Smith at present lives and also my other estate, both
real and personal for the best price that he can get for the same
and the money arising from such sale be apply'd towards the
payment of all my just debts and the remainder of the money
(if any) be delivered my wife by my Executor that she may be
enabled to give my children as good an education as my estate
will admit of. — Now it is my desire that the Money I have
devoted my Executor to deliver my wife in possession in her
hands during her natural life to enable her to comply with my
desire of cloathing and educating my children as I have
above directed. — This is my last will and I do hereby

should neglect along time my childrens education as I have wanted
 I desire my executors to see that it is done out of the money in my
 wifes hands — Now It is my will that at the death of my wife the
 money that may be left after raising and educating my children
 be equally divided between my children James Stanback, Polly
 Stanback, John Stanback, Mary Stanback and Sally Stanback or
 the survivors of them. Now I desire that my estate may not be
 appraised and I do hereby nominate and appoint Francis Ruggie &
 William Johnson Executors of this my last Will and Testament —
 Now I hereby revoke all former wills by me made? In Witness
