mind & remember that it is demanded for all men once to die I there-  
fore do appoint this for my last will testamant in the manner and  
form following — First of all I do take thought of my precious  
soul that Immortal part which I commend on to the hands of  
god And as for my Frank body to be commited to the mother dust  
from whence it was originated; In a decent like manner at the  
desirous of my executors here after named my further will and  
desire is that all my just debts may be paid by my executors and

of the money that shall be raised by the sale that I shall hereafte  
advise - Item I lend to my loving wife Amy Taylor the tract  
of land and the use of the plantation I now live upon and all  
the plantation utensils to her during her natural life also one  
Negro woman called Calie one Negro man named Brown & a  
Negro woman named Lucy one Negro man named Tom  
and a Negroe boy named Bob and all my stock of Hogs Hhup  
Hickewide cattle except two boars if so many I also lend unto  
my said loving wife Amy Taylor during her natural life  
one good feather Bed Furniture and one Bay Horse called  
Black & a Black mare called Bell & a Young Bay colt to her  
service during her natural life - Item I give & bequeath to  
my loving Daughter Linda Dorch one Negroe girl named  
Harriet and her service to her then heirs forever Item I  
give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Martha Taylor  
one Negroe woman named Jude and all her future &

to her and her heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath  
unto my loving Daughter Polly Jones Taylor one Negroe  
boy named Joe to her and her heirs forever - Item I give  
and bequeath unto my loving Daughter Betsy Taylor one  
Negroe girl named delpha and all her future Increase to her  
and her heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath unto my  
loving Daughter Susannah Taylor two Negroe boys (to wit)  
James and George to her and her heirs forever - Item I  
give and bequeath unto my loving Daughter Nancy Taylor  
one Negroe girl named Anna Her increase to her and her  
heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath unto my three  
younger children Goodwin, John, and Penelope Taylor  
at my wife's death the following Negroe that I had unto  
my said wife (to wit) one Negroe named Adam one Negroe  
woman named Lucy and all her future Increase one Negroe  
named Cincinnatus and a Negroe boy name 3 P.

all of my Negroes and their wives that I have not Advised  
(except a. Negroe woman named cale,) to be equally divided  
amongst my said three younger children at my said wife's  
death and if either of my children should die before they be of  
age or money then the part he longing to that; to be equally  
divided amongst all my surviving children or their representa-

tives at the death of my said wife - Item I give & bequeath  
unto my two sons Coswayn & John Taylor after the death of my  
said wife, the Tract of Land wherein I now live to be equally  
divided between them to them and their heirs forever -

Item the Negroe woman by the name of cale and all her  
future increase that I have left unto my wife I desire at her  
death to be sold together with all my personal estate except  
Negroes that I have before divided and the money arising  
therefrom to be equally divided among all my children -

therefore to be equally divided among all my children or their  
representatives - Item the ten trunks that I have before excepted  
together with the rest an residue of my Estate that I have not before  
bequeathed I appoint to be sold and the money arising therefrom  
to pay all my debts - my further will and desire is that the legacy  
given to my children shall stay upon the plantation till they  
finish the raising of Crops which is to pay my debts and all the  
money that is raised by the sale that's over and above paying  
my debt together with my other beds that I have not given away  
I give and bequeath unto my said loving wife Amy Taylor  
to dispose of as she thinks proper - And last of all appoint  
James Taylor my Brother and Abel Denton my son in law  
Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness  
whereof I have here unto set my hand seal this the day date

in the rest an residue of my estate that I have not before  
bequeathed I appoint to be sold and the money arising therefrom  
to pay all my debts — my further will and desire is that the legacy  
given to my children shall stay upon the plantation till they  
finish the ensuing Cap which is to pay my debts and all the  
money that is raised by the sale that's over and above paying  
my debt together with my other beds that I have not given away  
I give and bequeath unto my said loving wife Mary Taylor  
to dispose of as she thinks proper — And last of all appoint  
James Taylor my Brother and Abel Dotch my son in law  
Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness
