In the name of God amen. I Henry Walker of the Parish of St James County of North Carolina do hereby constitute and Ordain this to be my last will and testament touching all Affairs by me here before made in witness and Testimony following. I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Henry Walker in full his share and assigns forever one half of my Tract of Land lying in North Carolina Parish of St James as to valuation which half my son Richard Henry is to have his share after a Division takes place. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Francis Epes Walker the other half of my Tract of Land to him his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Bolling Walker the use of one half of the whole Tract of Land during her life which half is to be taken equally on each side of the dividing line between my sons Richard Henry and Francis Epes. Item I further give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife the use of the house in which she at present lives until my son Francis Epes comes of age or marries. Item I further give and bequeath unto my said wife a Negro woman named Molly and all her Children Viz. John, Nelson, James, Billy, Henry, Isabella the Cyers Sally Gilbert and the increase of the female Slaves above mentioned to her her heirs and assigns forever. Also all the household and Kitchen furniture that I do possess of also a Sixth part of all the Stock of every kind my debt is that my

Executors

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Executors hereafter named shall endeavour to keep the negroes and Stock of
all hand together to be worked on the plantation untill my son Richard Henry
walks in his eye and then continue after the proper maintenance of my
wife and family to be applied to the discharge of my debts but provided
my hereafter named Executors should think it prudent. I desire
they may sell a sufficient Quantity of the Negroes and Stock to
discharge all my just debts and the Remainder of all my Estate
not herebefore devised. I give to equally divided among my Children
as follows. Francis Black Richard Henry Walker John Walker
Sarah Spots Walker John Walker Separately to them and their heirs
proportioning my present Estate of Tobacco which I desire may be
apportioned to the discharge of my account with John L. Todd
and the several part of my Stock which I desire unto my daughter
Jane Todd. I do hereby constitute and appoint the following persons
to be and act as Executors of this my last will and testament Viz
Francis Epps George Barron Matthew Bollinger Walker Peyton Apworth
and Samuel Goode Signed this twenty ninth day of April 1791 and
I do further will and declare that I do give my wife Martha's Bollinger

of my aforesaid Child and I do further Ordain that the said Child have a
Share it is my request that at his coming to the Age of twenty Years that my
sons Richard Henry Walker and Francis Epps Walker shall at their option
either make him up one third of the Land or allow him as much money as
the one third may be valued at by persons to be appointed by the Court
