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I be to live thereunto and take the benefit of

my son Jacob Bugg after a Division of my Estate
and such Maintenance to be at the Discretion of my
Executors. — I will my Beloved Son Jacob Bugg
all my Lands and Tenements, Which I am now
Acquainted of by him to be Enjoyed and at his Disposal —
Also Give to my Beloved Daughter Lucy Bugg
Two Negroes Eddie and Agnes them and their
increase by her to be enjoyed and at her Disposal —
Also Give to my Beloved Daughter Betty Bugg
Two Negroes Coby & Lucy them and their increase
by her to be enjoyed and at her Disposal —

My Will and Desire is that all the Remainder of my
Estate should be Equally Divided Between my
Three Children Jacob Bugg Lucy Bugg and Betty
Bugg at such time that my son Jacob Bugg do

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now to the age of twenty one years and the first
of my Estate untill that time. I do hereby bequeath to the
Ornaments of my Wife and the Children mentioned in
my Estate - I do hereby do something and the
Ordain and appoint Bennett Borden and my son
Jacob Borden my sole Executors of this my Last Will
and Testament - and do hereby utterly disallow
 revoke and disallow all and every other former
Testament Wills Legacies Bequests and Executions
by me on any Wives before named Wills and
bequeathed Ratified and Confirmed this and the
to be my last Will and Testament in Witness
