

In the Name of God Amen. I Jesse Bugg of the County of Mecklenburg being Sick
and weak but in sound Sense and memory calling to mind that its Approched for
all men were to die do make and revise this my last Will and Testament in
Manner and form following. I therefore first Recommend my Soul to
God that gave it me hoping through and by the Merits of Jesus Christ I shall
be partaker of Eternal happiness, and as for what temporal Estate God in
his Goodness hath been gracious in his distribution to me in this life I give and
bequeath in manner and form following. Viz. I do leave unto my loving wife
Mary Bugg enduring her widowhood my land and plantation whereon I now
live seven Negroes viz. Luck, Doll, Lott, Aggy, Tobey, Liddy and Abbin
three Horses, Minnie's Head of Cattle all my Stock of Hogs all my
furniture and all my household goods. Item my Will and desire is that my wife
Mary Bugg in during the life time of my wife Mary Bugg all my land and plantation
and all my household goods and the growing boundary (viz) beginning at the little creek
and running up the edge of the old Dutch to a new cut road called the Dutch
road that road to my Sandy Bottom Thence down that Bottom to the
Brook on one side Thence down the Side of said Hill to Samuel Youngs
Fence Thence up said Fence to said Buggs Fence Thence down said Buggs
Fence as it runs on the old Springs line formerly owned by
the Little Creek Thence up the Creek to the beginning line.

as it stands in Samuel Buggs last will & testament that his
will is that the Little Creek I have up the Creek to the beginning line
at the upper end of the Old Field. Now I give and bequeath unto my
son Jesse Buggs one young sorrel mare and fifty shillings to purchase
a saddle to him and him and his heirs forever. The same I have given
my son Jesse forever with all and bring it to full value. Now I give
unto my son Samuel Buggs to him and his heirs forever. I have I give
and bequeath unto my son William Howard Buggs Ten pounds to be
paid him out of my Estate on the day a Division or distribution
of my Estate takes place to him and his heirs forever. Now I give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Buggs one Bed and furniture
to her and her heirs forever. Now I have unto my Daughter Margaret
Howard including her life one Bed at her Death my will and desire is
for it to be Equally Divided between her children. Now I give and be-
queath unto my Daughter Mary Sandifer Buggs one Bed and furniture
to her and her heirs forever. Now I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel
Buggs Ten pounds to be paid him out of my Estate on the day a Division or

or distribution of said Estate takes place. I leave it to her and her heirs and assigns
my son Benjamin Sugg to be paid him out of my
Estate on the day a Division or distribution takes place. I leave it to her and
her heirs and assigns my son James Sugg to be paid him out
of my Estate on the day a Division or distribution takes place.
Now my will and desire is that at the Death of my wife Mary Sugg
that all my tract of Land with her and my son John Sugg together with
seven Negroes three horses nineteen head of cattle the Stock of Hog House
hold and Kitchen Furniture with all future increase shall be sold by my
Executors after due publication may made me with the purchase money
paid among the other heirs in the double third share and with
several debts repaid and the residue of the money being paid
of my Estate after paying the said Legacies above mentioned I will be
witness I signed before me testifying William Pitt John Sugg Jacob
Sugg Jesse Sugg August Sugg the above named Benjamin Sugg
Martha Sugg John Sugg and William Rowan Sugg to them
and their heirs forever test. I Constable Nathaniel and John
Black the undersigned John and Jane Sugg my wife and sole heirs
to her now last Will and Testament in testimony whereof I have
