form Following Viz. I have devised unto my loving wife Phoebe Taylor  
one Negro Man named Peter during her Natural life and I have in the  
power of My Executors if they think it proper to Sell the said Negro and to buy  
another with the same money that will Sute her better to do it and after  
her death it to goe unto her Child that she is now living with the said  
Negro and all the profits that arises from the Estate to it and to her for  
ever. I do likewise Give unto wife Phoebe Taylor one horse and the remain-  
der part of my Estate to her and her heirs forever, my Desire is that my Estate  
shall Not be Appraised. I also Appoint and Ordain Charles Burton and  
Henry Moody Junior to be Executors and Phoebe Taylor Executrix to this my  
last Will and Testament and in witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and affixed my Seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1791

At a court held for Mecklenburg County the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1792.

This will was proved by the Oaths of Elizabeth Moody and Mary Moody Witnesses  
therein named who made oath there to and together with Francis Moody and Mary Moody  
his servants entered into and acknowledged their record in the public office hundred  
pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a probat  
thereof in due form & duly being returned for the executor therein named to do in in  
the probat when they shall think fit.
