together with all my jewels.

I then I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Thomson
the sum of ten pounds also one bed and furniture to her and her
heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath to my son Arthur Thomson the
sum of ten pounds also the sum of eight pounds to his
heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath to my son John Thomson the
sum of ten pounds also the sum of eight pounds to his
heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath to my son Henry Thomson the
sum of ten pounds also the sum of eight pounds to his
heirs forever.

I now my will and desire is that all the tolls and hand cash in
possession and whatsoever may be due me be collected & the whole
amount be applied in the purchase of a negro or Negroes at the
direction of my executors and afterwards married.

It is my will and desire is that all the estate to wit my
wife together with all the residue or remainder of any estate
of what nature soever not yet disposed of be equally divided
amongst my four children Henry Anne, William and John
& them or and also the child my said wife is supposed
to be pregnant with to them and their heirs forever.

My will further is that if any of my children die before the
age of 21 years or marries or be put to dying be equally
divided amongst the survivors or their heirs.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife to be
the guardian of the said Henry Anne and my friend Samuel
Allen to be the guardian of the said William and John my
said wife and she execute in and execute of their right
and will to the utmost hereby wishing and making void all
will or words by me herebefore made to the contrary whereof I have
signed at my hand and affixed my seal this 29 day
