In the name of God - Amen. John Jeffers of the County of Mucklenberg
being aged and infirm but of perfect mind and sound memory he given unto
God willing to resign the activity of my body and having taken it in testimony
for all men here to see do hereby declare that this is my last will and testament
that is to say Principally and first I recommend my Soul into the great Almighty
God who gave it and my Body to be committed to the Earth to be buried
secreely at the discretion of my Executors without doubting but at the general resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of God and as
touching such worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with after my
funeral Expenses and my Just debts be fully Satisfied and paid I give as
followeth Viz. I surprise my will and desire is that my beloved wife continue
her life with my son Richard Jeffers as long as she lives and in case of her death
as my then unforeseen accident that she should both share or maintain and

Use and I give is that when my three sons hereafter mentioned have a
suitable test in maintaining her out of their respective first burials
given them I also give unto my wife the following Negroes (to wit) Jack
M. & out of such together with her bed and furniture and one horse
which I give with a saddle and bridle for her use at life. I then I give and
bequeath to my son Samuel Jeffries the following Negroes Viz^t Waggoner,
Clas George Annica, Dick Jane, and Maria. I then I give and bequeath
to my son Abitha Jeffries the following Negroes Viz^t Tom Harry Judy
Paco Isaac, Lella and Sarah with her future increase. I then I give
and bequeath to my son Richard Jeffries the land of land wherein I now
live containing six hundred and thirty acres in the same more or
less to him and his heirs I also give unto my son Richard the following
Negroes that he has York Sam Lashy and Sarah at my wife
death my well and where is that at the death of my wife Jack
M. & and Frank Increase may be equally divided between my three
sons Samuel Abitha and Richard Jeffries. I then I also give to my
son Richard Jeffries all my household and kitchen furniture together
with six or seven head of cattle sixteen head of sheep one yearling Bay horse
and all my other things provided he pays to my friends as follows Jeffries
D. J. & Co.

and that my other two boys should be made to my children Thomas, James
 Peter, Frederick and a bed and furniture also to my granddaughter Jane
 before my death. I desire and give and bequeath and that be
 say the Balance due my grandson from me as guardian for which
 I give him one horse, four cows and C. H. There my wife with
 desire is that the residue of my estate be divided and that not before
 mentioned be divided between my two sons Sampson and Achilles
 Also that the Negroes may be kept together this near to me as a wife
 and that to be applied to the purchase of buying my debts and
 to the money due me which is to be collected and applied to that
 purpose and when completed with the Balance to be divided between
 my wife and three sons Sampson Achilles and Richard Jaffin in
 two portions to their lands Lastly I do constitute and appoint
 My loving wife and my beloved sons Sampson Achilles and
 Richard Jaffins Executors to this my last will and Testament
 making and disannulling all former Wills by me or for me

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Robert Smith and Andrew Tiegans Witnesses in Court and Ordered to be recorded and on the Motion of Richard Justice one of the executors therein named who made Oath & together with Thomas Buwell, Richard Wynn Thomas, Vannant and Thompson Poulkes his Securities intermed and Acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand pounds conditioned as the said deeds Certificate was granted him for bearing special duty in and from which being released for the said executors therein named to join in the probat where they shall think fit.

power of my Executors if they think it proper to sell the said Negro and to buy
another with the same money that will suit her better so as it may after
her death I do give unto her child that she is now pregnant with the sum
of £100 to be paid to her child when she is born so that she may have the same
