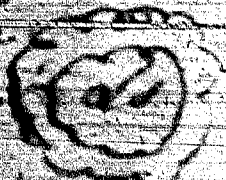


Know all men the record of God to me. The 5 day of June

my will as that my estate may be divided that int say
I give my lands to my son Philip if no other male I give
from my wife of mine if another son the said land to be
equally divided between the two brothers also my personal
estate that is equally amongst my wife and children
when they grow up shall be of age if she remains a widow

wife or make a conveyance in then should be a speedy
division of the the manors aforesaid I appoint my brother
Thomas Roberts my executor My wife Ann Roberts
of this my last will and testament and I do hereby

other former testaments & wills confirming this and
wishes to be my last will and testament For Witnesses
being I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and
year above written
